Local winners of the tournament, scorekeepers, employees, Cliff and others who have taken part in recent events were honored.

The Crown Imperial Major League featured four 600 series Friday night. Lactation averages are calculated on the commonly-employed two-milkings a day, 305 day, mature equivalent basis. This provides a uniform basis for comparison and selection in registered Holstein breeding programs.
