Church League Semi-Finals Slated For Sat.

Huntsville To Meet East Dallas; All Stars To Play Shavertown

Two major upsets were the highlights of Saturday night's Church League action as the end of the season play-offs began.

Huntsville played a ball-control game and defeated Harveys Lake, 55-52, and East Dallas displayed amazing accuracy as it smothered St. Therese's 67-40.

A possible third upset was thwarted when Prince of Peace could produce only four players to start the game and had to forfeit it to Shavertown even though they came out on top of a 65-59 decision.

FORFEIT GAME
In the first game, after the fifteen-minute waiting period failed to produce another Prince of Peace player, Shavertown's Ernie Widmann offered to play with Prince of Peace, who also had Don Roberts, who is not on the roster, dress for the game. Prince of Peace maintained a 32-28 halftime lead and built it up gradually to show a six-point margin at the end of the game. For Prince of Peace, Don Rome was the offensive standout as he hit for 13 goals for a total of 26 points. Tom

Richardson was next in the scoring column with 11 points, supported by Don Purvin's and Ernie Widmann's 10 each. Shavertown had three men score in the double figures; Bob Hontz with 19, Gene Brobst with 14, and Stan Davis with 10. This victory that Shavertown obtained automatically through the forfeit puts them into serious contention for the play-off championship after finishing on top in the League for the regular season.

In the second game, a determined Huntsville team brought forth a well-balanced scoring attack coupled with control of the rebounds and turned these assets into a hard-fought victory by defeating League runners-up Harveys Lake, 55-52. It was evident from the opening tap that this was going to be a nip-and-tuck ball game. Huntsville turned a one-point first quarter lead into a two-point halftime lead and a three-point third quarter lead which they never relinquished up to the final buzzer. Brothers Clint and Charlie Brobst shared scoring honors for the winners, posting 10 points apiece. Another brother, Harold, stood out with his rugged rebounding and aggressive play while also managing to score 6 points. Flashy guard Bob Grose tallied 9 points and displayed some quick dribbling for his part in the victory. For Harveys Lake, it was veteran guard Dick Searfoss turning in an outstanding job as he fascinated the fans with his deadly two-handed set-shots from various points behind the foul line. Don "Zeek" Hinkle, the League's lead-

ing scorer, produced 13 points and pulled down innumerable rebounds in a losing cause. Coach George Searfoss' boys have had their troubles these last few weeks of the season as they dropped three consecutive games, which is unusual for this team, having spent the major part of the season in first place.

East Dallas Fired Up

In the third and final game, a fired-up East Dallas team turned in a beautiful game for the second week in a row, and soundly thrashed third-place St. Therese's by a score of 67-40. From the opening tap it was never in doubt, who had the upper hand in the contest, as the East Dallas quintet, paced by big Bill Lewis' rugged rebounding and scoring, hit with phenomenal accuracy from the field. The winners had three men near the twenty-point mark with Frank Tenca and Bill Lewis scoring 19 points each, and manager Fred Lamoreaux tallying 18. St. Therese's, who was having "one of those nights," had only one man, Bob Bolton, score in double figures with his 14 points. Brothers Keith and Brent Yeisley were next in scoring with 6 points apiece.

Next week, Shavertown, by virtue of drawing a bye, will meet the following All Stars in a game at 7—Harveys Lake; Dick Searfoss, Bob Harris, and "Zeek" Hinkle. St. Therese's; Pete Letts, Keith Yeisley, and Jack Hogan, Prince of Peace; Tom Richardson, Don Rome, and Lee Ohlman.
