**Huntsville And Shavertown Tangle Saturday Night For Championship**

In Saturday night's Church League action, Huntsville defeated East Dallas in the semi-finals of the playoffs 37-36. Shavertown defeated the All-Star team 73-64, and St. Therese's defeated Harveys Lake in an exhibition game, 59-55.

The All-Star team, composed of players from Harveys Lake, St. Therese's and Prince of Peace, built up a nine point lead at the first quarter only to see it vanish as Shavertown "got hot" in the second quarter, building up a 36-33 halftime lead.

From then on, Shavertown gradually picked up points to maintain a commanding lead and the buzzer sounded ending the contest with Shavertown out in front 73-64.

For Shavertown, it was a team effort, since four men scored in double figures; Bob Hontz with 22, Bill Oney with 18, Gene Brobst with 16, and center Ernie Widmann with 14. They also grabbed most of the rebounds. The All-Stars had four men in double figures also; Bob Harris and Larry Crispell with 12 tallies each, and Pete Letts and Don Rome with 10 each. Guard Dick Searfoss scored 8 points in the first period.

**Huntsville Wins**

Huntsville remained in contention for the play-off trophy by virtue of their low-scoring 37-36 victory over a rough East Dallas team. As a result of this victory, Huntsville will meet Shavertown for the play-off championship.

It was a nip-and-tuck all the way, with Huntsville jumping off to an early four-point first quarter margin, only to see East Dallas leading at the end of the third quarter by three points.

Huntsville, with a two-point lead with approximately one-and-a-half minutes time remaining, started to freeze the ball. Clint Brobst, dribbling beyond the foul-line, was fouled by East Dallas, who hoped to get possession if Clint missed his free throw. The strategy failed. Clint coolly sank five consecutive fouls to ice the game. Winners and losers, had only one man each in double figures; Gary Dietz had 10 points. East Dallas had Frank Tencza with 11 tallies. Clint Brobst scored nine points for Huntsville, managing but two goals, but came through with five all-important foul conversions. Bill Lewis stood out with his rugged rebounding for East Dallas.

**Exhibition Game**

St. Therese's led Harveys Lake, virtually all of the way for a 59-55 victory. The Saints had three men in double figures; Bob Bolton, runner-up for scoring honors in the League, had 27 points; Pete Letts, who stood out with his rebounding, had 18 points; and Keith Yeisley had 10 points, 9 of which he scored in the third quarter.

Since it was an exhibition game, the Saints let Prince of Peace's Don Purvin play on their team, and he, along with guards Bob Shotwell and Jack Hogan, displayed some fine passing and play-making. For Harveys Lake, Don "Zeek" Hinkle, who has the dubious distinction of being the League's leading scorer, tallied 24 points on 12 field goals, and he was supported by Bob Harris' and Larry Crispell's 15 points each. Guards Chuck Allabaugh and Dick Searfoss also played fine games, although they failed to score.
