Ms. Laura Krum, 81, Buried At Oaklawn

Mrs. Laura M. Krum, 81, Pioneer Avenue, Shavertown, died early Saturday morning at General Hospital, where she had been admitted by Kingston Township ambulance a few hours earlier.

She was buried Tuesday afternoon in Oaklawn Cemetery, following services conducted from the Kniffen Funeral Home by Rev. Robert D. Yost, pastor of Shavertown Methodist Church, and Rev. Frederick Eidam, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran.

Mrs. Krum was the widow of Clark O. Krum, foreman at Vulcan Iron Works, who died four years ago.

She was a native of Larksville, and lived for a time in Plymouth and Wilkes-Barre before moving to this area in 1937.

Mrs. Krum took an active part in women's organizations of Shavertown Methodist Church. The Berean Bible Class conducted services for its late member Monday night.

Surviving are: a daughter, Mrs. John F. Clause, at home; a sister, Mrs. Blanche Pierson, Plymouth; a granddaughter, Brenda Clause, at home, a number of nieces and nephews.

Mrs. Verna Miers, 80, Suffers Fatal Stroke

Mrs. Verna Miers, who died at her home in Jackson Township Tuesday night, will be buried tomorrow in Lehman Cemetery. Past and present ministers of the Lehman Methodist Charge, Rev. Mrs. Miers, 80, suffered a cerebral hemorrhage early Saturday morning, and never regained consciousness. Inactivity would have been intolerable to her. She was exceptionally active for a woman of her years, always present at Grange Society meetings and at church occasions.

She belonged to Jackson Methodist Church and its W.S.C.S.; Jackson Fire Auxiliary; Jackson Grange, Pomona Grange 44, and State and National Granges.

Her husband Herbert died in 1945. She was born at Ceasetown, daughter of the late Wayman D. and Lydia Jane Shuster Cease, and lived in Jackson Township most of her life.

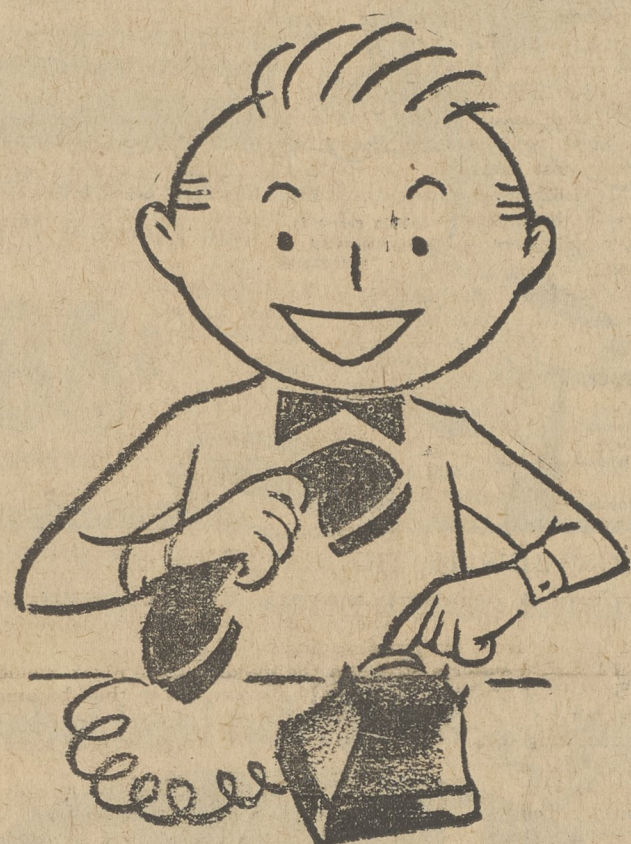
