More Killed By Bicycle Accidents Than Total Killed By Airplanes

Did you know that more children are killed in bicycle traffic accidents in this country each year than the total number of persons killed in airplane accidents?

In 1959, the last full year on which statistics are available, 480 youngsters were killed in bicycle accidents, while 360 persons died in airplane crashes. During the same year, more than 27,000 bicyclists were injured in accidents, many disabled permanently.

According to the U. S. Junior Chamber of Commerce, four out of five of these accidents occur because bicycle riders violate traffic laws or the rules of safe riding. In more than one-third of the bicycle accidents, riders run their bikes into cars or other vehicles. In others, they are struck by cars because they fail to yield the right-of-way, make improper turns, disregard stop signs and signals, or otherwise fail to exercise proper riding caution.

The U. S. Junior Chamber is taking steps to reduce bicycle accidents this year through a national bicycle safety program designed to impress on young bicycle riders the need for safe riding. Because the greatest number of accidents involve 5 to 14-year-olds, the Jaycees are concentrating on the youngsters.

Called the "Lite-a-Bike" safety program by its originators, the safety campaign will be conducted by Jaycee chapters throughout the country. It will consist of a three-phase program involving free safety inspections of bicycles, test riding courses in which youngsters have the opportunity to demonstrate their riding skills and knowledge of safe riding practices, and free bicycle markings of reflective tape.

Vegetable Preferences Of Pre-School Children

Children may refuse to eat a vegetable because they do not like the way it is prepared, observes Mrs. Ruth Darbie, extension home economist, Luzerne county. Mothers who have a problem getting their children to eat vegetables may be interested in a study done at Iowa State University.

Nursery school children were offered green beans, asparagus, carrots, and rutabagas, each prepared in four different ways. Green vegetables were creamed, buttered whole, buttered pieces, and au gratin. Yellow vegetables were served as buttered julienne, buttered grated, raw, and creamed.

As a group, children preferred raw carrots and rutabagas, and au gratin green beans and asparagus. Buttered green beans also rated high. Creamed vegetables received a low score, although the preparation was identical to au gratin, except for the buttered crumb topping.

There was great variation among children in their choices. Observations indicate that some children prefer vegetables prepared by one method, some another, while still others may have no preference. So, if a child refuses to eat vegetables one way, he may eat them if they were prepared differently.

be placed on the handlebars, front forks and rear fenders of bicycles to enable motorists to see them at night. The tape glows brightly in the beams of automobile headlights and can be seen by motorists as far away as 2,500 feet after dark. Because many accidents occur when motorists are unable to see bicycle riders clearly at night, the tape provides additional nighttime safety.

Members of the Junior Chamber will work closely with police officials and school authorities in their own communities during the bicycle safety program. Each program will feature a one-day "Bicycle Rodeo" at which youngsters have their bikes inspected, ride the test course and get free reflective markings. The Jaycees will follow up the Rodeo events by establishing locations where free inspections and markings will be offered throughout the bicycling season.

In addition to reducing the number of annual bicycle accidents, the Jaycees hope their program in traffic safety instruction will have a long-range effect when the young cyclists of today become the adult drivers of tomorrow.
