**Ambulance, Fire  
Company, Start  
Coin Card Drive**

**First Quarter In  
Slot Due May 13,  
Last September 23**

Combined coin campaign of Dallas Community Ambulance and Dr. Henry M. Laing Fire Company will start Saturday, May 13, with distribution of coin cards prior to that date. Cards, with spaces for twenty quarters, hold \$5. The first quarter is due May 13 in the upper lefthand corner.  
With weekly contributions for annual upkeep of ambulance and fire companies, cards will be filled September 23, and collected shortly thereafter.

Kunke drive for ambulance funds will start July 8, and end September 23. Kunke has its own fire company, but cooperates with the rest of Dallas Township and Dallas Borough in supporting the ambulance association.

During 1960, Dr. Henry M. Laing Fire Company responded to 37 calls, including 20 grass fires, eight dwellings, four cars, one garage, and one restaurant. Volunteers numbered 132 men. Losses were estimated at \$24,800.

The ambulance answered over 100 calls.
