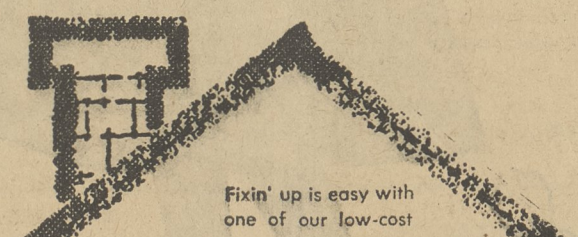

Prince of Peace Mens Club will hold its last Communion Breakfast for the season Sunday Morning. Dan MacGuish Director of Admissions at Susquehanna University will speak on the "Church-Related College".

Born in Nova Scotia of American Parents, Director MacGuish was educated there and in Boston, Mass. After returning to Nova Scotia, Mr. MacGuish enrolled at the internationally famous McGill University, Montreal, Quebec. After graduation, he matriculated at Columbia University for graduate work. Receiving advanced degrees at Columbia, he was for some time Counseling officer of the YMCA in New York City.

During World War 2, he saw active service and upon discharge, he worked for the Selective Service Rehabilitation program, then entered private employment with the Borden Milk Products Co. in the Personnel Department. Moving around the country for six years had its drawbacks, and when the then President of Susquehanna University, G. Morris Smith, invited Director MacGuish, to affiliate with the University he accepted. Arriving on the Susquehanna Campus in 1951, he became Director of Public Relations, Alumni Secretary and Dean of Admissions.
