

Chance For Graduate Student To Get Rotary Fellowship For Foreign Land

President Joseph Sekera of the Dallas Rotary club announces that Rotary International is offering this year to this area, a full paid scholarship for study of one year in a country other than the student's own country. Students desiring to apply must be seniors or post-graduate students wishing to study for a master's degree. They must be between the ages of 22 and 29 and unmarried.

Each applicant is to be prepared to place on the application the names of three Universities in other countries of their choice, the major study they will pursue; and their scholastic record. This Fellowship is highly competitive and includes all expenses for one year, including tuition, books, travel expenses and spending money. Students do not live with Rotarian families except in rare

cases, but do live at a location of their choosing, with the request that they consider dormitories in order to mingle with students. One Fellowship is awarded every other year in a Rotary District. Our Dallas District comprises seven counties in northeastern Pennsylvania. About 145 fellowships will be awarded this year to students from 67 countries to study in about 45 other countries. The most recent Rotary fellow from our district is Miss Judy Kellerman of Clarks Summit who will soon return from a year's study in Switzerland. David Vann, a Westmoreland graduate, was the Foundation student in 1958

and studied in the Union of South Africa. Applications may be secured from Paul Gross, International Service Chairman, Coal-O-Matic, Trucksville, Pa. They must be completed and in his possession by August 1st. This rule is rigidly enforced. The student will be interviewed by a district committee in the fall. Dr. Les Jordan is a member of that committee. The student selected would study during the school year of 1962-63 in another country.

Peach Yield Increased With Added Fertilizer

Peach trees can yield one-fourth more fruit than usual with a fertilizer program of high rates of nitrogen and medium to high rates of super phosphate and potash. This has been shown in eight years of experiments by the Agricultural Experiment Station at the Pennsylvania State University. Addition of 7.5 to 10 pounds of 20 per cent superphosphate per tree annually—together with the nitrogen and potash rates used—has yielded approximately 100 bush-

Check House Wiring For Electrical Load

If the house your family is living in was wired many years ago, chances are the wiring is overloaded, cautions Mrs. Ruth Darbie, extension home economist, Luzerne county. Overloaded or frayed and worn wiring could cause a serious fire or electrical shock.

Before an accident happens, inspect the wiring for safety. Then, if your wiring needs to be replaced, Mrs. Darbie offers these suggestions:

See that wiring bears the label of the Underwriters' Laboratory. UL is the symbol to look for.

Make sure wiring is the correct size for its use.

Use adequate wiring of high quality materials to guard against unnecessary replacements and extra cost for materials and labor.

Have wiring installed according to the national and local electrical codes and have a qualified electrician install it.
