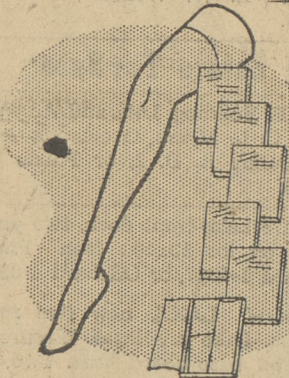

Mrs. Ziba Smith surveyed the towering wedding cake iced with white, and virginal in its spun sugar decorations. "It took three days, three dozen eggs, and loads of cake flour and sugar," she announced. "Do you use a mix?" "Heavens, no. This is a real cake, made from an old fashioned silver cake recipe, flavored faintly with almond. And I mold the cupids and wedding bells, and make royal icing for the outside. That's the fourth coat of icing, on top of the sealing and priming coats." Mrs. Smith exhibited her equipment. "You use four square cakes for the bottom layer. Here are the pans. Then you begin mounting round layers in graduated sizes. There are the circular pans. And you end up with sort of a tower. And the bride and groom figures go on top. Ziba makes the plywood foundation. See the four little half spools he uses to hold up the platform?"

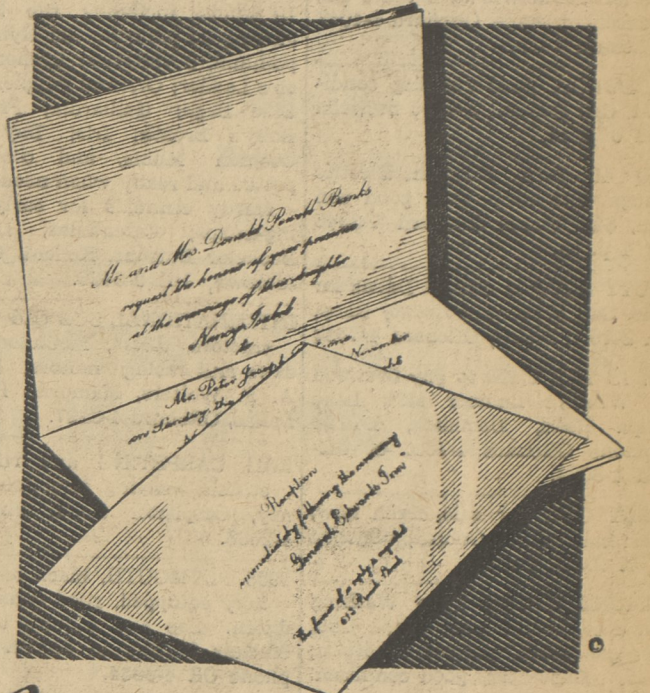
