Joins Marines, Will Miss Graduation With Class

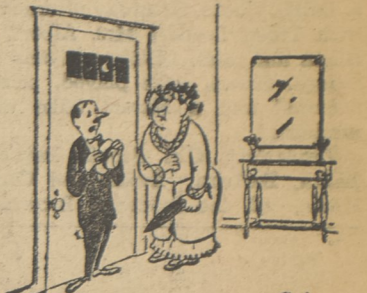
