**Chances Are 8 To 1 Stocks Will Advance**

Babson Park, Mass. On the basis of historical precedent, chances are over 8 to 1 that the stock market will be higher in August than in early June, according to a study just completed by Spear & Staff, Inc., investment advisory organization.

Since 1897 there have been only 7 years in which the Dow did not show a summer rally (1901, '03, '11, '17, '20, '43, and '48), and the average decline was only 2.1% by the end of August.

"Difficult as summer rallies are to rationalize," said Roger E. Spear, president "the record is too strong to dismiss as mere coincidence. And, although the Dow has recently penetrated into new ground, we believe that there is still a strong possibility of a summer rally in 1961."

**Veterans Ask**

Q. I had active service from January 1, 1920, to March 12, 1922. I hold an honorable discharge. Can I consider myself a veteran?

A. Yes, you are a veteran by virtue of your military service. However, you are not a veteran of a "war period." World War I eligibility for benefits is considered as starting April 6, 1917, and ending on November 11, 1918 except for those veterans who served with the United States Military Forces in Russia, in which case the war period starts April 6, 1917, and ends April 1, 1920.

Q. My World War II veteran husband deserted me and the children

through no fault of mine. He died recently. Am I eligible for pension? A. You are a veteran's widow despite desertion and are eligible for pension if you can qualify under the income and estate limitations. Q. My father, a World War II veteran, and my mother never actually married. After her death his mother brought me up. Now he has died. My birth certificate shows his name as my father. He always supported me. I am now going to school and am not married. Am I entitled to pension until I am of age? A. Yes. Make application immediately with your nearest VA office.
