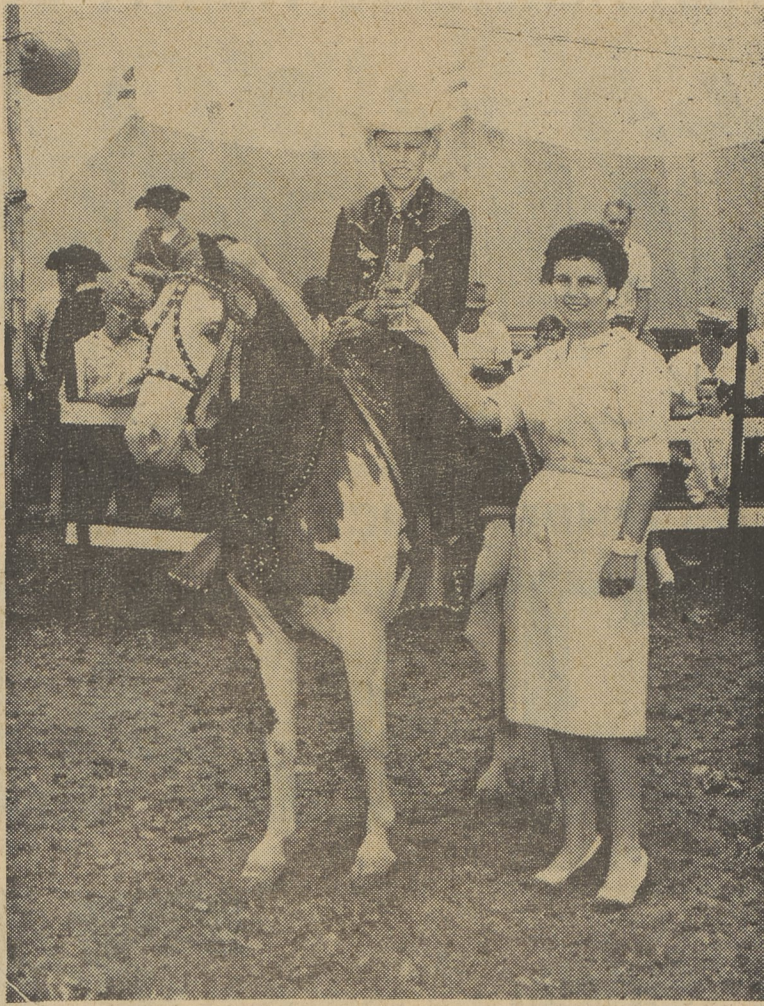
The senior Smiths went down to attend the christening, and Mrs. Waldow spent the week with her son and his family.

Big Pony Classes At Horse Show



Ricky Post of R. D. 2, Shick-shinny will again ride his pony, "Ginger," in the pony classes of the Lehman Horse Show on July 4; he is shown receiving a trophy from Mrs. Stuart Marks when he took first place in the class captioned "Ponies Under 14.2".

There are three pony classes scheduled for the July 4th show; second class after the opening of the show Tuesday morning will be the "Lead Line Pony Class", open to children 7 years of age and under. The pony must be led by an older person and is judged on suitability, manners and kindness; last year there were 17 entries in this popular class.

This year the class captioned

"Ponies Under 14.2 Hands," indicating the size of the pony, will be divided into A and B divisions to facilitate judging. Young exhibitors will show their pony at a walk, trot and canter. Judging will be based on gait, manner and suitability of pony to riders.

"Park Riding, Ponies," is scheduled for late afternoon, open to children 12 years of age and under. Ponies must be under 14.2 hands. Riders will be judged on park riding at a walk, trot and canter.

In a very few years youngsters who are handling their ponies so expertly will be seen taking the jump courses and riding the sported horses as they follow this path which they love.

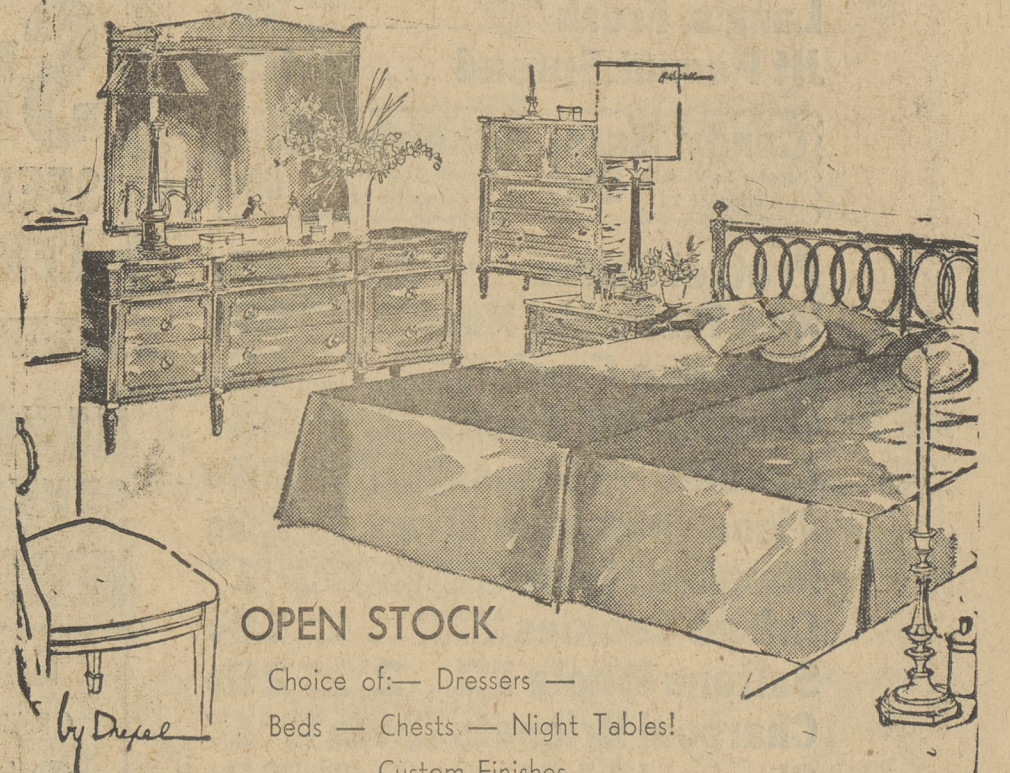

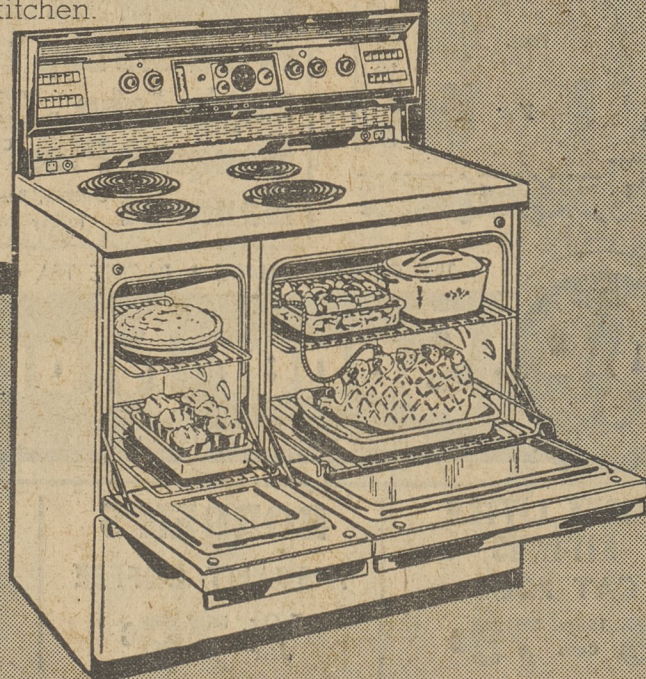
