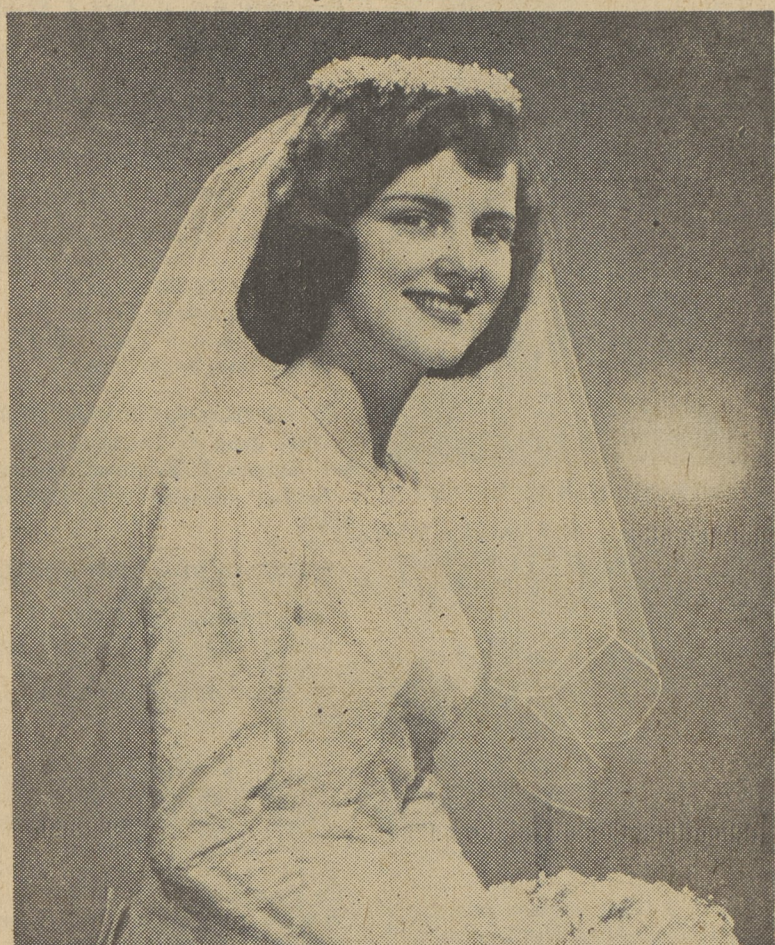
Fathers Day Picnic

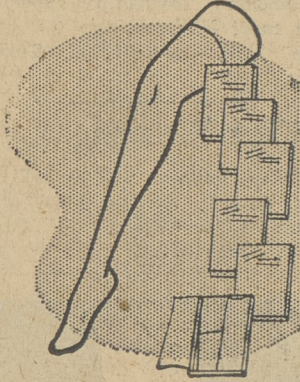

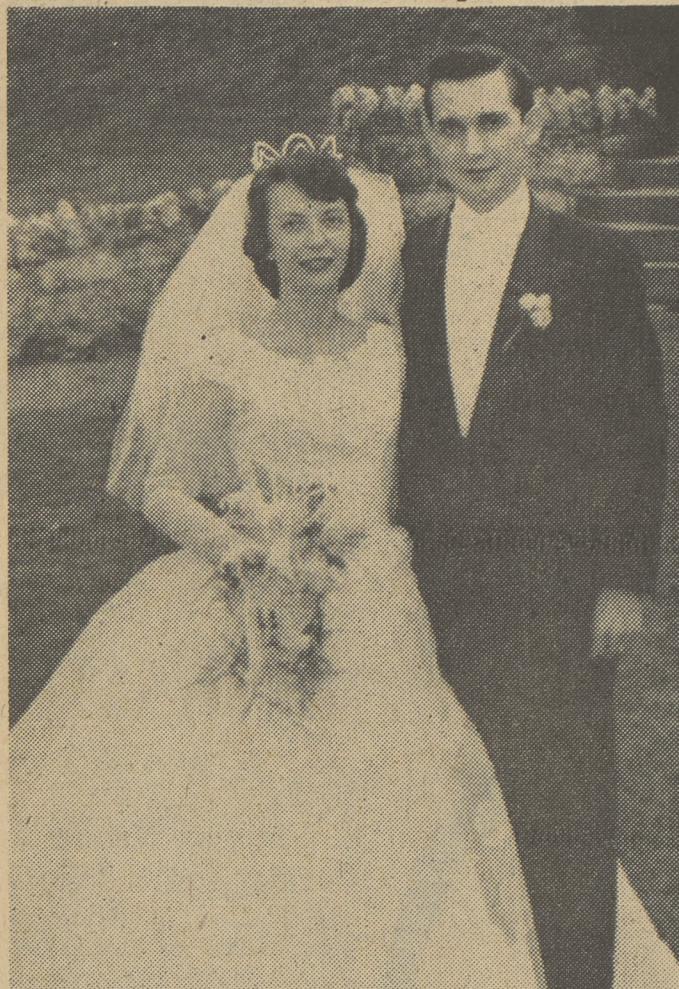
