UNOPENED PARACHUTE SOLVES MYSTERY

An unopened parachute lying by the skeleton of a flyer lost in the Adirondacks last December, solved the mystery which until Tuesday surrounded the disappearance of S/Sgt. Pierre Maheux, brother of Mrs. Robert Maxwell of Demunds Road.
While the other seven crew members of a B52 bomber operating out of Plattsburg Air Force Base parachuted to safety and were picked up within a short time, Maheux' fate was undetermined. A search party of which Mr. Maxwell was a member in January, came within two miles of the spot where the skeleton was discovered.
The Maxwells are leaving tomorrow for Auburn, Maine, where the body will be buried on Monday. Death was instantaneous when the flyer's head struck a rock.

Dallas Kiwanis Men In Toronto

Gardner And Ackerson Attend Convention

Jerome R. Gardner, vice-president, and Alfred H. Ackerson, secretary of the Kiwanis Club of Dallas, attended the Forty-Sixth Annual Convention of Kiwanis International in Toronto, Ontario, July 2 - 6, joining 17,000 other Kiwanians, their wives and families, in the largest convention in the organization's history and the first in Canada since World War II. Shuman, President of the American Farm Bureau Federation; and Lieutenant General Roscoe C. Wilson, USAF, Deputy Chief of Staff for Development.
Also on the convention rostrum were the presidents of the two youth organizations which Kiwanis sponsors - Steven D. Cople, 17, Yuma, Arizona, President of Key Club International, a high school boys' service organization with 52,000 members in 2,100 clubs; and John Hoyt Blalock, University, Alabama, President of Circle K International, a college men's service organization with about 5,500 members in 350 college clubs.

This evening, the Fifteenth Annual Library Auction will start. Chicken barbecue supper is scheduled to begin at 5, using Gate of Heaven parking lot.
The parade of antique cars, Stegmaier Band, and marching units, will form at 5:30 at Shavertown Methodist Church parking lot. Led by parade marshal Myron Baker, it will move up Pioneer Avenue to Main Street, Main to Huntsville Road, thence to Spring Street and the barbecue.
