Teacher's Pay Up 18%

Pay for teachers and adminis trators in Pennsylvania's public school system has increased 18% over the past five years, the State's Bureau of Research revealed in a report issued last week. In 1956 the average pay for an

employee in education was \$4,649. The same employee in 1961 receives \$5,507. But administrators still take home larger pay checks

Compared with the average salaries of teachers in other states with comparable populations, Pennsylvania's pay-scale ranks next to last. Only Texas pays less, with an average of \$4,530. California ranks first with an average salary of \$6,765 for its teachers.




