Bob Rogers was the batterymate for Mekeel in both contests. Rogers also hit two homers during the season.

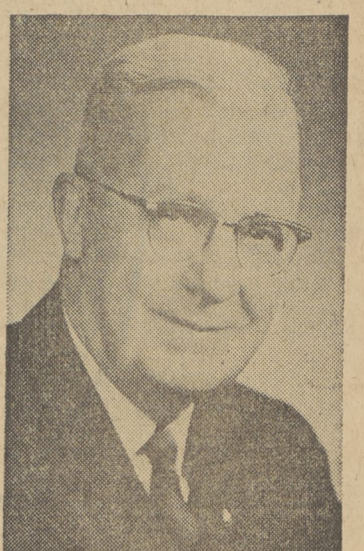
