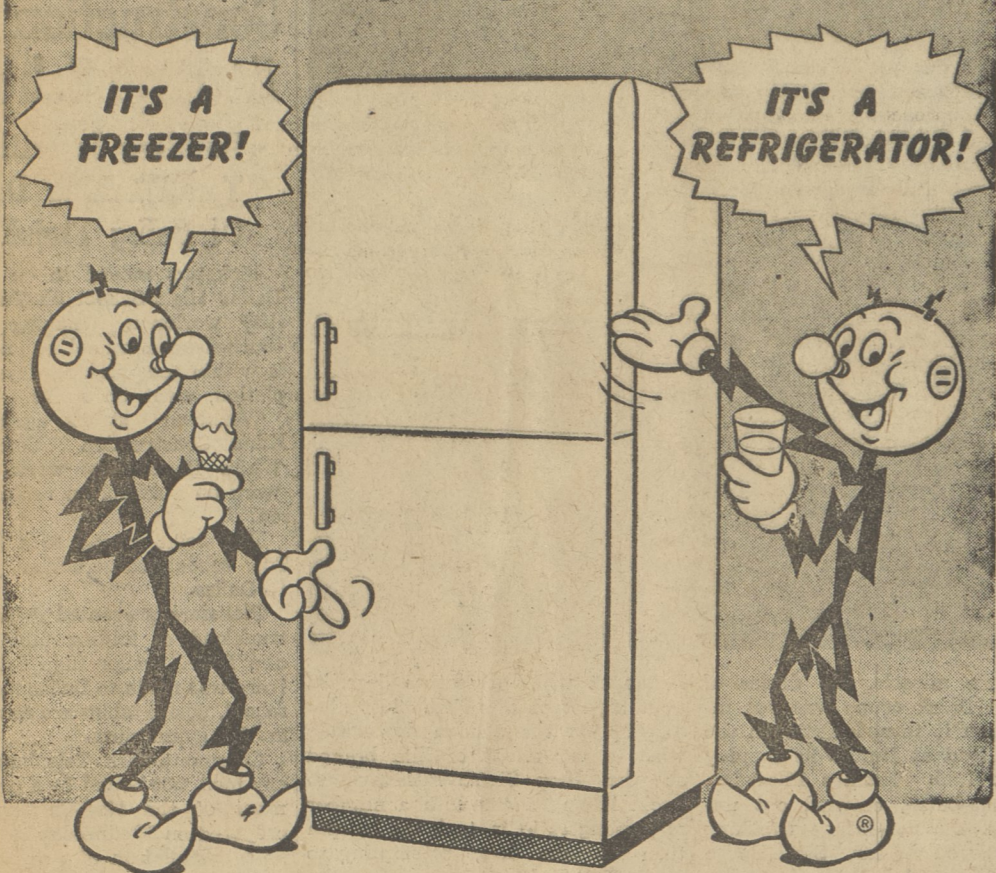

Carverton Methodist WSCS Lays Plans For Summer Flower Show

Carverton Methodist Church WSCS is planning its annual summer flower show for August 23 at the Mountain Grange Hall in Carverton. Information may be obtained from Mrs. Stephen Stearn, chairman.

A cafeteria supper will be served from 5 to 7 p. m.

Show hours are 3 to 9:30 p. m. Judging will take place from 11:30 to 3, at which time only judges and officials may be present. Entries may be brought the night before the show, 7 to 9 p. m., or in the morning of the show from 9 to 11. All amateurs are welcome to exhibit.

First, second and third place ribbons will be awarded in each class, with a special award for outstanding exhibits in each of these divisions: specimens, bouquets, arrangement, fruits and vegetable, and niches.

For children from 4 to 10, there is a special class for a Bouquet for Grandmother; for children from 11 to 16, bouquet or houseplant.

Niches will include "A Holiday" and "Morning in a Garden." Reservations for niches must be made with Mrs. Richard Pryn by August 16.

Division I embraces the customary specimen blooms, and house plants.

Division II, everlastings, bouquets, and miniatures. Miniatures are divided into four classes: arrangements in vases not over two inches high; from 2 to 4 inches; up to 5 inches; and matched vases, not over 5 inches tall.

Bouquets may be arranged for church; for the mantelpiece; for dining room table; for coffee table; or for picnic table.

Division III includes arrangements; Division IV, fruits and vegetables; Division V and VI, children and niches.

Abandons Ministry For Time Being

Rev. and Mrs. Albert Reining will move from Dallas to East Branch, N. Y. sometime between the fifth and tenth of August. Rev. Reining is temporarily changing his field from the ministry to teaching.

On Wednesday, he signed a contract with East Branch school administration to teach fourth, fifth and sixth grades in a two-room school of the East Branch area, with the understanding that he be free to study for his Master's Degree in administration during the school term and the summer vacations at Oneonta State Teachers College.

Rev. Reining, during his tenure as pastor of Dallas Free Methodist Church, has been active in education, serving on the PTA board and taking an alert interest in educational problems of the community.

Rev. Reining holds an AB from Greenville, Illinois.

The present move is dictated in large part by ill health of Mrs. Reining.

Joseph Gronski Is Found Dead

Proprietor Of Grove Discovered By Friend

Apparently dead since Monday night, when he put his dog out for a run, Joseph Gronski, 71, was found Wednesday morning by a Dallas man who had called to inquire after his health.

Knocking on the door of Mr. Gronski's home on the Demunds-Center Moreland Road Henry Urban of Maple Drive noted that the door was locked and that the small dog appeared ravenous as he begged for food and water. Mr. Urban could see something on the pantry floor by peering through the window.

Feeling that something was amiss, he got help from a neighbor, and the two men lifted the door from its hinges to gain access.

Mr. Gronski had been seen Monday afternoon at 4 by Chief Irwin Coolbaugh. A few days previously, Mr. Urban had driven him at Dallas to get medicine at the drug store. He had been complaining of not feeling very well, and had thought the hot weather was responsible, increasing the misery of his asthma.

Deputy coroner Edward E. Edwards testified to death.

After the body had been removed, Mr. Urban found dog food and fed the famished dog.

Mr. Gronski operated a small grove at the rear of his home where organizations held picnics and clam-bakes. He moved to the area many years ago, after retiring from employment in the mines, and giving up the restaurant which he operated in Kingston.

He was a native of Poland coming to this country in 1906. He leaves relatives in Poland, including a brother Charles, who is visiting in this country.

Two sons, Chester and Joseph Jr., live in New Britain, Conn.
