- REMEMBER:** There was opposition in both Lake and Lehman Townships to the closing of the old one-room schools
- There was an injunction against Lake Township School to prevent it in the 1920s from building even a high school
- There has been opposition to every move to join or consolidate school districts.
- REMEMBER, TOO:** The prime purpose of the present jointure three years ago was to create a new high school to alleviate the crowded condition in all of the districts.
- KEEP IN MIND:** If a new high school is not built, LAKE-LEHMAN will be one of the few districts on the east side of the Susquehanna that has not completely re-organized with new high schools and met the requirements mandated by the State. (Wyoming, Columbia, Susquehanna and Bradford have met the State's requirements with new construction)
- INVESTIGATE AND THINK FOR YOURSELF:** Drive along any of the roads of our community. Look at the new homes owned by young families with growing families of three, four and six pre-school children. How do you think we can get along without improving our facilities to take care of them in the immediate future?

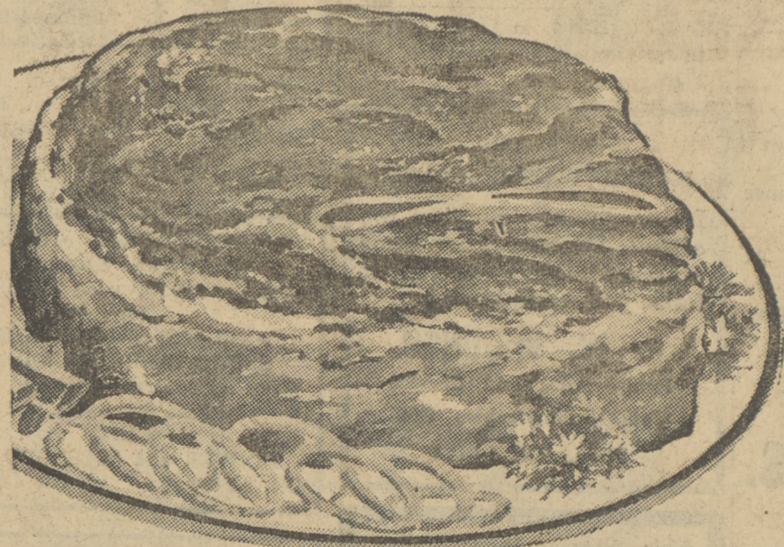
