D. 1, a graduate of Lake-Lehman High School, will study in the Surveying Technology curriculum, and Richard Powell Terrace Drive, Shavertown, will take up Drafting and Design Technology. William J. Fielding, Box 178, Shavertown, R. D. 5, a graduate of Lake-Lehman High School, will major in Surveying Technology, and Dale P. Culver, Carverton Road, Wyoming, R. D. 3, will take Drafting and Design Technology. He is a graduate of Westmoreland High School. All men will study for two academic years to earn an Associate Degree in Engineering.

Returning for a second year are Thomas G. Baer, Harvey's Lake, R. D. 1, and William E. MacMillan, Noxen, R. D. 1. Both men successfully completed their first year at Penn State Center in the Surveying Technology curriculum and next month will begin their final year. Also ready to begin his second year at Penn State Center is James T. Reese, 138 Meadowcrest, Trucksville, who is taking Drafting and Design Technology.

Penn State University's Wilkes-Barre Center has graduated a large number of Back Mountain students during its many years' existence. Among those who have achieved success in their chosen fields are: Edward J. Drafting and Design Technology trains young men and women for employment in machine design, tool and die design or structural layout.

Electrical Technology prepares graduates for technological assignments with electrical utilities, manufacturers of electrical and electronic equipment, and electrical maintenance and instrument departments of various industrial corners.

The Wilkes-Barre Center also offers the only Surveying Technology program leading to an engineering degree in the entire Eastern United States. Surveying Technology provides a knowledge of the elements of surveying as applied to construction, land topographic, geologic, city and photogrammetric surveys.

at the Guthrie School Building, 669 North Washington Street, since 1951, when expanding enrollments necessitated a move to larger quarters.

The center operates an extensive evening school program called Continuing Education which offers a variety of non-credit and credit courses including real estate, management training, advertising, corporation finance, algebra, and public speaking. These courses are designed to aid men and women in obtaining additional know-how in their specific jobs and positions which aid them to solid advancements.

This year Penn State University is going on the four-term system. The Wilkes-Barre Center also will schedule classes according to the term system, but has not yet scheduled the University's summer-term phase in this term system class periods will run for seventy-five minutes during ten weeks of instruction. There will be Fall, Winter,

and Spring Terms.

The Fall Term will begin September 18, for Freshman Orientation and Registration Classes will begin on Monday, September 25. Freshman class of over 100 students is expected.

Geisinger Changes Name As It Adds Facilities

It is no longer Geisinger Memorial Hospital in Danville. It is Geisinger Medical Center, a change in terms long overdue, as Geisinger has been functioning in that capacity for the past fifteen years, with a steadily increasing reputation. Education and research will be stepped up.

Gate Of Heaven Parochial School Anticipates Enrollment of 825

Gate of Heaven Parochial School, which had an enrollment of 791 last year, is anticipating a 1961-1962 school population of at least 825 children from first to eighth grades.

The sixteen bright classrooms will be used to capacity.

School will start the day after Labor Day, with a full session, including cafeteria service. Buses will travel over the regular routes.

On Friday, September 8, on the day of the Feast of Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, God's blessing on the school year will be asked at a special Mass which all pupils will attend.

Four lay teachers supplement the teaching staff of Sisters of Mercy, and mothers volunteer to help in

the cafeteria, serving the hot noon lunch.

Gate of Heaven draws pupils from a widely scattered area in the Back Mountain, including Sweet Valley Harveys Lake, Lake Silkworth, Pikes Creek, and Carverton, as well as from the more populous centers of Dallas, Shavertown and Trucksville.

Rain fell on Monday and Wednesday, relieving drought that was preventing ripening of green tomatoes, and beginning to scorch the grass.

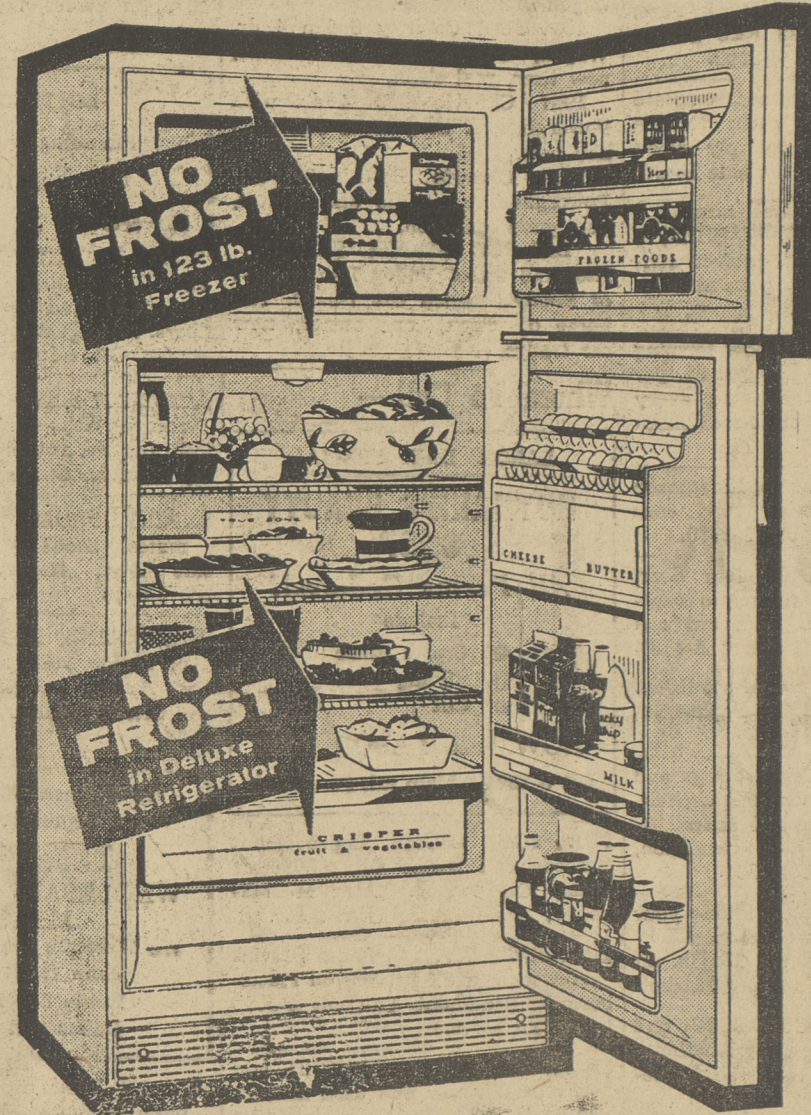
