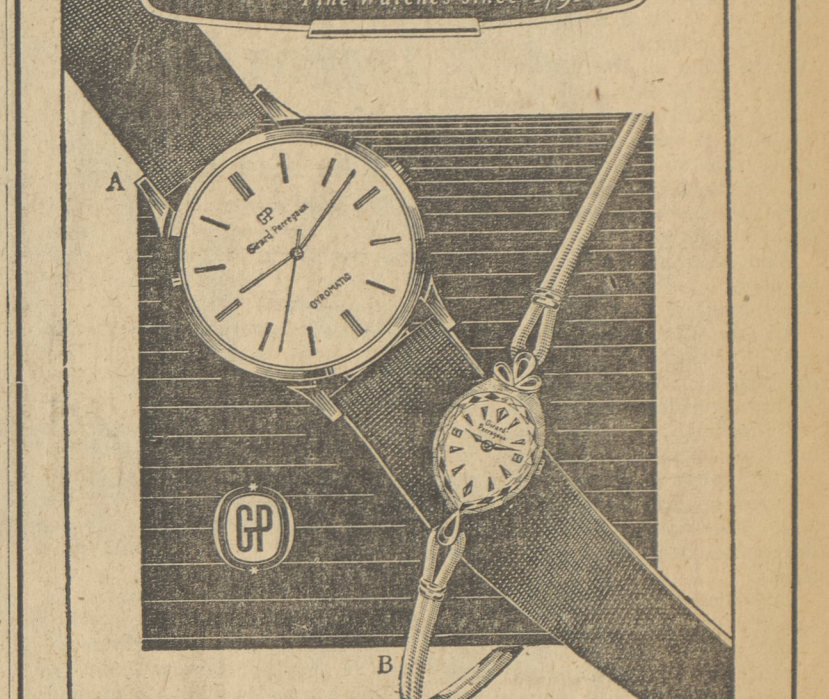
## Mr. and Mrs. William Shoemaker To Celebrate 50th Anniversary
