Tommy Space, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Space, had the misfortune to fall and break his arm in two places. The same arm had been cracked about one year ago.

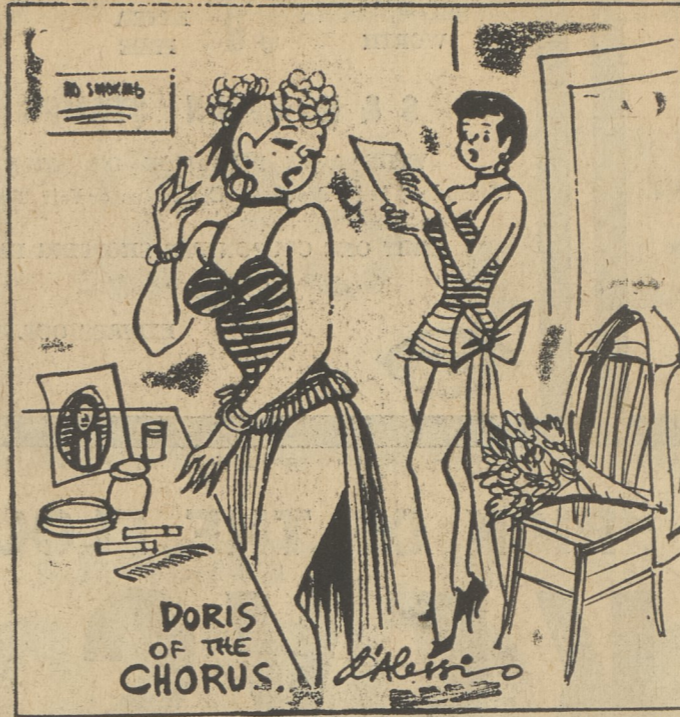

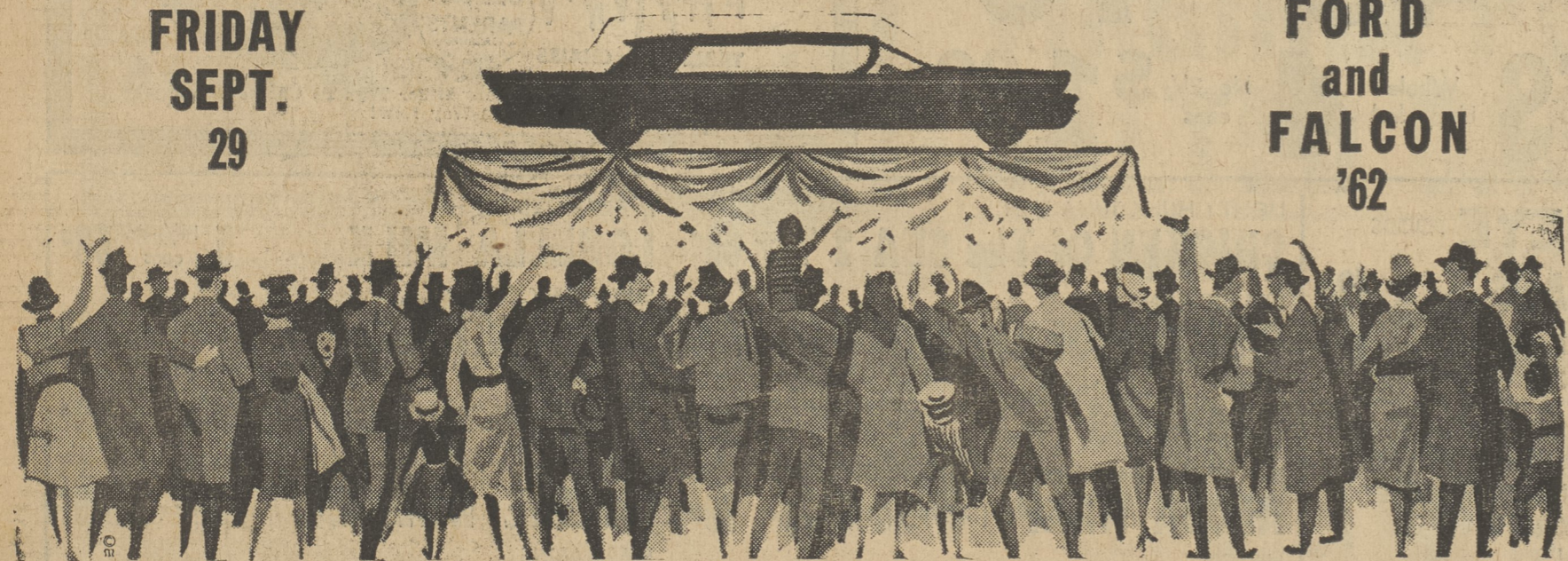
