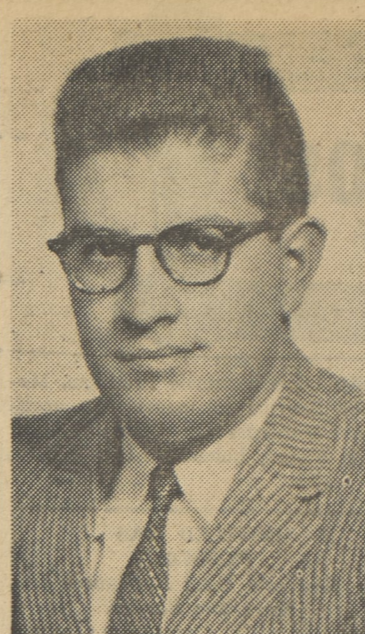

Anesi Scores 2 In 13-6 Victory
 Knights Travel To Wyoming Saturday

Lake-Lehman had its hands full Saturday before turning back a stubborn Northwest 13-6 on the Northwest gridiron.

Northwest opened the scoring on a 25-yard pass play, Gayewski to Dave Whitebread. The score was set up by a fumble recovery by lineman Frank Wilczynski.

Trailing 6-0 at half, Lake-Lehman came back strong following intermission and moved 70-yards for its first score with Don Anesi carrying it over from the eight-yard line. Kenny Ellsworth followed with the placement to give Lake-Lehman a 7-6 lead. Anesi and Stan Palmer did the bulk of the ground gaining for the Knights in the drive.

In the final quarter Lake-Lehman put a Northwest punt in play on its own 35 and again put on a sustained drive, this time for 65-yards, with Anesi plunging over from three yards out. Again Anesi and Palmer did most of the work as the Lake-Lehman forward wall opened the holes. Ellsworth's kick was blocked and Lake-Lehman held a 13-6 lead.

Dave Whitebread, six-foot wingman for Northwest had another fine afternoon hauling in ten passes. Last week he hauled in three TD passes in a 32-24 loss to Nescopeck.

Bill Yarnell, fleet-footed half-back, had another long TD run called back for the second week in a row. Bill is a freshman, and a fine prospect for coach Ken Wood.

Lake-Lehman (1-1-1) in conference play moves into Wyoming Saturday afternoon for a contest with the Redskins of Pete Podwika.

Lake-Lehman will have its hands full since the Redskins show a (2-0) record in league play and a (4-0) record overall and have not allowed a score, blanking St. John's 6-0; Luzerne 21-0; Jenkins Twp. 25-0 and Edwardsville 24-0.

Wyoming, with a number of returnees from last season, is a heavy favorite to capture the Conference title.

With all-conference center Bob Munson back to bolster the line along with lettermen John Podwika, Charles VanCamp and Richard Ginanni and such stalwarts as Pete Kozlowski and Al Danowski in the
