

Joseph Mundy Dies In Prime

Was Well Known Political Figure

Joseph A. Mundy died Thursday morning in the prime of life at Mercy Hospital, where he had been admitted as a surgical patient September 13. He was buried at Mt. Olivet on Saturday, following a Requiem Mass celebrated at St. Therese's.

Mr. Mundy, only 52, was a familiar political figure in the Back Mountain, active as president of the Jefferson Club, rebelling against the Democratic party and casting his lot with the Republicans during the 1958 campaign, when he headed the "Democrats for McGonigle" movement.

In the 1957 primaries, he polled 11,000 votes, coming close to victory as an independent Democrat in the race for Prothonotary.

Residents of Shavertown will long remember Mr. Mundy's spectacular Christmas outdoor display on Pioneer Avenue.

Son of Mrs. Genevieve Gallagher Mundy and the late William T. Mundy, he was born in Exeter. He moved to Shavertown ten years ago, after having lived at Harveys Lake for a similar period. He was in the advertising field, self-employed.

He belonged to St. Therese's Church and its Holy Name Society; Knights of Columbus, Wyoming Valley Old Time Boxers Association,

Shavertown Fire Company, Back Mountain Protective Association.

He is survived by his widow, the former Frances Chisko of Edwarsville; his mother; a daughter, Mrs. Joseph Leonard, New York City; brothers: William, Rhode Island; Paul, Chicago; Sisters: Mrs. Ward Conway, New York; Mrs. Joseph Clement, Harrisburg; Mrs. Neil McDermott, Wilkes-Barre; Mrs. John Reap, West Pittston.

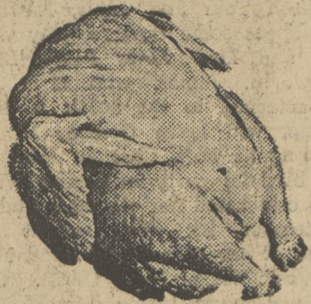
