Free Methodists Welcome Pastor

Rev. Ralph Smith Was Born In Africa

Dallas Free Methodist Church's new minister, Ralph Charles Smith, is a native of Portuguese East Africa, born in the mission field of Inhambane, the first, and for many years the main mission station of the Free Methodist Church.

Though he has not been in Africa since he was twelve years old, he says he would feel completely at home, should he return to work with the colored people of that area. In fact, before he decided upon the ministry as a vocation, he had considered studying medicine, with the goal of returning to Portuguese East Africa as a medical missionary.

His parents, the late Rev. Carroll and Rosa H. Smith, brought Ralph home to this country for a three-year furlough when he was two and a half years old, returning to Africa when he was five. A furlough when he was less than twelve years old, saw him in this country permanently.

Steamer tickets bought, arrangements made for the return to Africa when son Ralph was fifteen, Mrs. Smith was stricken fatally ill, and the mission field was abandoned.

Rev. Ralph Smith comes to Dallas from Windsor, N. Y. He served the congregation on a supply basis during the summer months, moving into the parsonage with his wife and youngest daughter over the Labor Day weekend. Ruth, 14, is enrolled at Dallas Junior High School in the

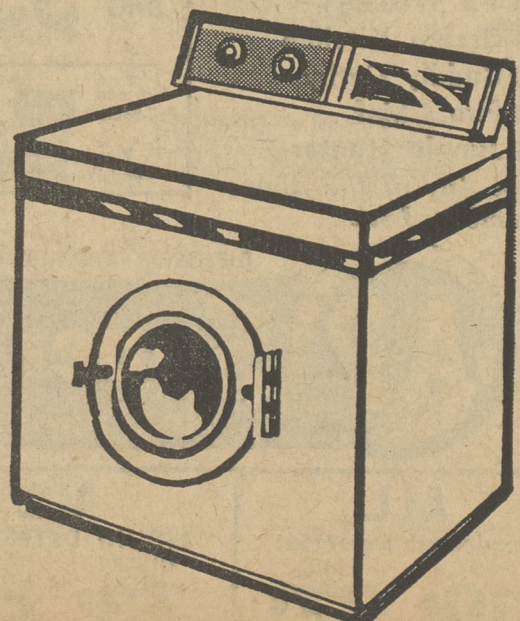
