Local Artist Has Whale Of A Time Gets Material For Exhibition Picture

J. Philip Richards, well-known artist, and art teacher at Dallas Junior High School and for adult evening classes, reports that he had a chance to see sulphur bottom whales in action this summer off the coast of Maine, and get close-ups of the huge creatures for interesting water-colors.

Mr. Richards operates a summer Inn, "The Hillcrest" at Ogunquit. When the traditional cry of "Thar she blows," was heard at Ogunquit, Mr. Richards sailed out to sea, getting close enough to the ten whales to get many photographs for future reference.

"Getting close enough to these huge sea creatures was a risky business," he says. "We had to sail within fifteen feet of them at times to get what we wanted."

"The ten sulphur-bottoms seventy to eighty feet in length, con-

tinued to feed, sound, blow tremendous jets of water into the air. They sounded like a thousand giants clearing their throats in unison.

"At one point, I felt the way Jonah must have felt when he was looking straight down into the whale's throat. The whale spotted the small craft, turned, sounded, and dove deep under the boat, coming up on the other side."

Mr. Richards has several paintings now on exhibition in Maine as a result of his Moby Dick adventure.

This past week, Mr. Richards had a painting accepted by the National

Arts Club of America for its annual autumn show at Gramercy Park, New York City. This show is an open competition for top artists in the United States. To be an exhibitor is considered an outstanding achievement.
