Missionary Speaker



HOWARD W. YODER

Rev. Howard W. Yoder will speak at Shavertown Methodist Church on Missions Sunday, both at the 11 a.m. Worship Service October 29, and at the Family Night Supper Sunday at 5 p.m.

In 1929, Mr. and Mrs. Yoder went to South America, serving with the Methodist Board of Missions. Dr. Yoder was principal of Colegio Andino in Huancayo; La Escuela America in Lima; the Pan-American Institute in Panama City; and the American Institute in La Paz. Since 1948, he has

been superintendent of Methodist Schools in Latin American Central Conference.

In addition to his other responsibilities, for fifteen years he was pastor of a local church, superintendent of a district, and treasurer of the Perry Mission.

In 1954, he became executive secretary of the Committee on Cooperation in Latin America. He has visited all Latin American countries and taken part in the ecumenical conferences. He has directed studies of the Latin American area in the annual missionary conferences held under auspices of the Personnel Department of the Division of Foreign Missions.

He received his early education in Kansas schools, graduating from Southwestern College, Winfield, Kansas in 1922. He taught high school for two years before going to New Jersey for seminary training.

While a student at Drew Theological Seminary, he was pastor of the Newfoundland Methodist Church. He took his LL.D. degree in 1951.
