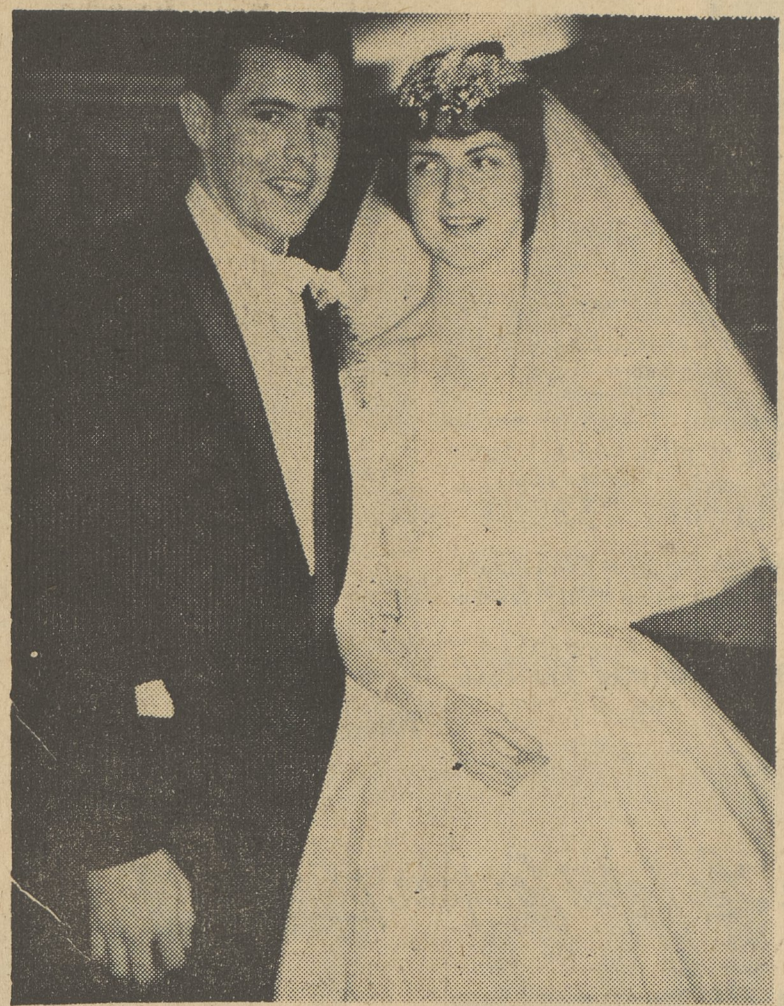

The couple was married in East End Primitive Methodist Church by the Rev. Anthony Iveson. Their only attendants were the pastor's wife and daughter.

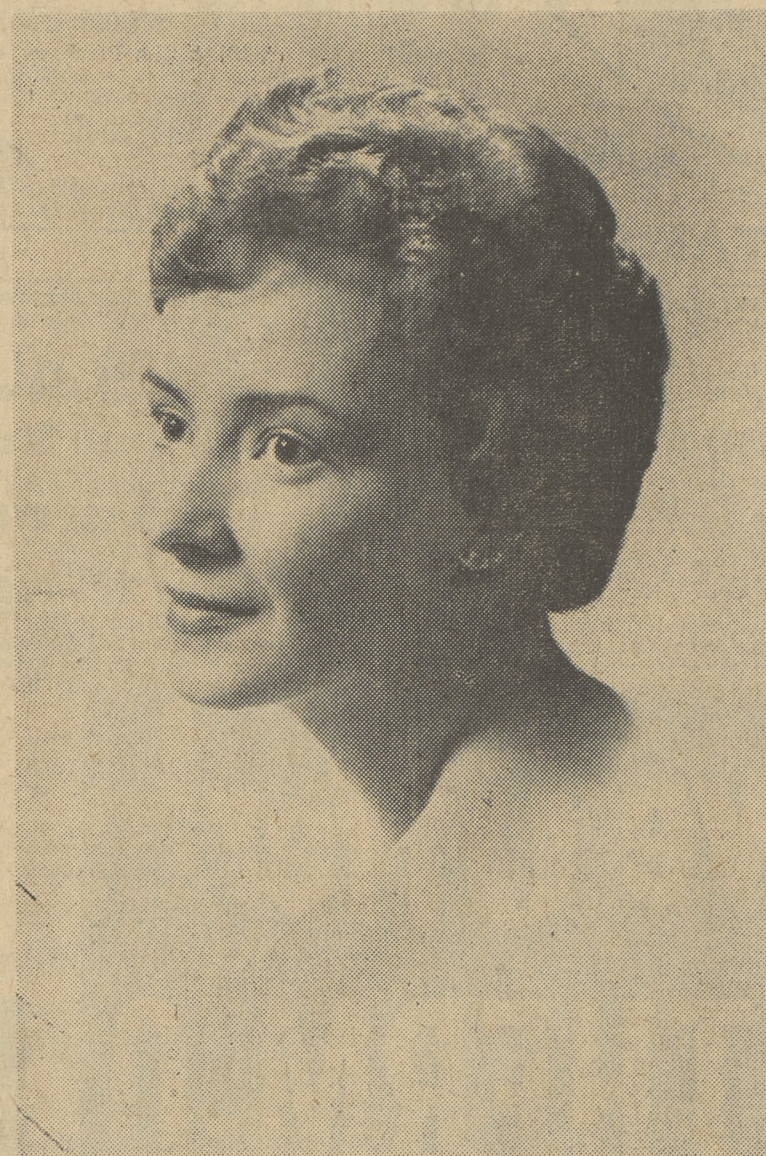
