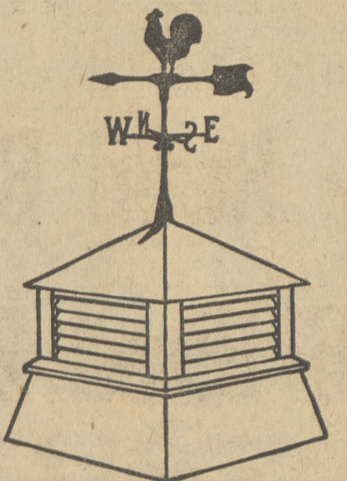
Junior Club To Hear Miss Helen Anderson

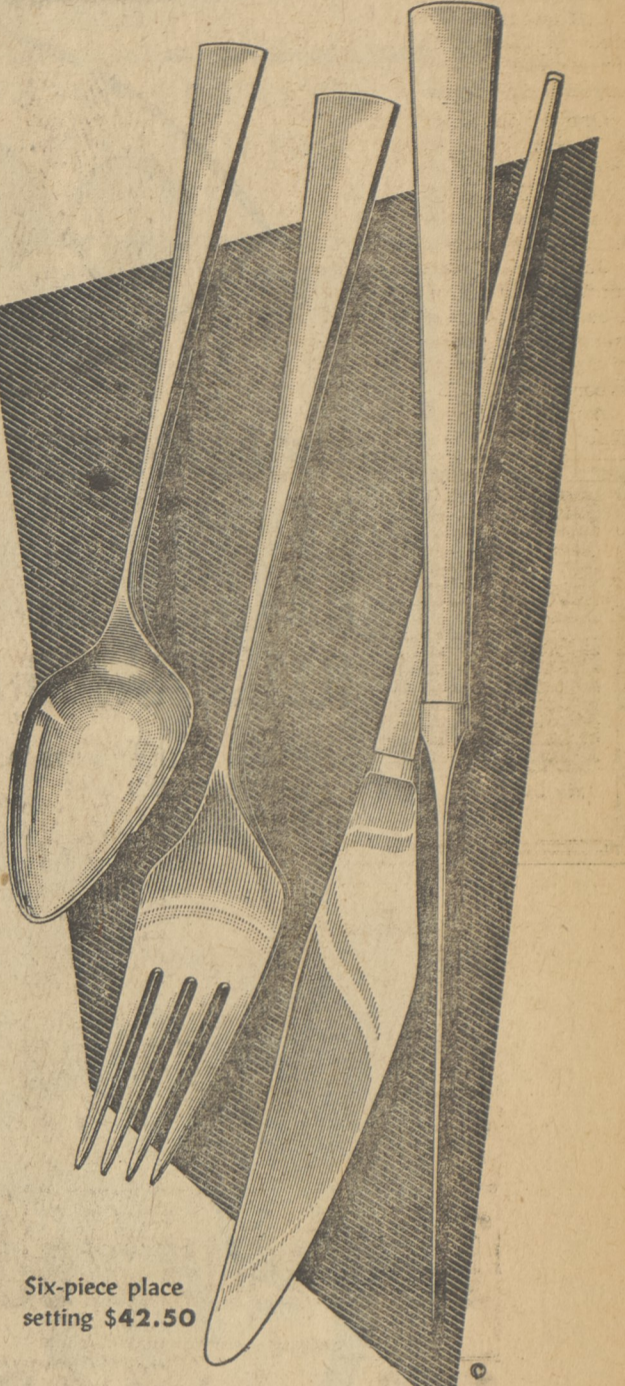

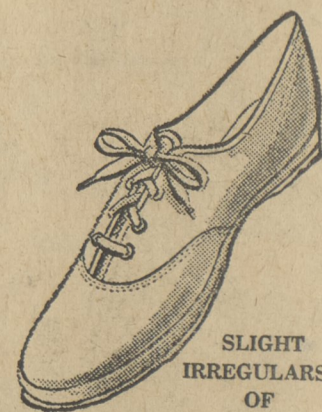
