John Leek, 71, missing since he started from the home of his niece Mrs. Chester Nesbitt, Main Highway, Shavertown, for a walk in East Dallas Saturday morning...

Mrs. Nesbitt had searched every road within walking distance on Saturday. It was her uncle's custom to take a walk every morning...

By Saturday night the search widened, local police and State police joining.

Retracing the lost man's route, he apparently walked into the woods near the East Dallas Methodist Church, and emerging, lost his direction, turning up the hill instead of staying on the highway.

Deputy Coroner Steve Glova stated that the wanderer had probably died sometime Sunday afternoon, having suffered a cerebral hemorrhage.

The body was found by Mr. Miller, who with Charles Mahler was hunting small game.

The funeral will be held this afternoon at 1 from Kerr's Funeral Home in Tunkhannock, with burial in Warden Cemetery.

Mr. Leek, a retired lineman for Commonwealth Telephone Company at Tunkhannock, had made his home with his niece for the past several years. He leaves another niece, Mrs. Effie Lee Bates of Birmingham.

Book Mending Is Explained

Area Librarians Attend Workshop

All books in Bradford, Sullivan and Wyoming counties should now look neat and sturdy.

Librarians of school and public libraries throughout the area were invited to meet on October 25 in the Wyalusing Valley Joint High School library to attend a workshop in book mending.

The meeting was sponsored by the Bradford-Sullivan-Wyoming County Librarians in its constant effort to improve service to the public. Harold Stewart of Gaylord Bros. Inc., a well-known library supply house of Syracuse, N.Y., demonstrated new methods and materials.

Book mending is one of the constant problems of library administrators in their effort to hold costs to a minimum and to keep their book collections in good condition. With new plastic materials and easier methods of repairs, it is now possible to do so.

The following schools were represented at the Workshop: Wyalusing Valley, Northwest, Bradford, Tunkhannock, Athens Area, Tri-County. Librarians from the following public libraries were present: Towanda, Wyalusing, Tunkhannock, Laceyville, Athens, Dushore and the Bradford-Sullivan-Wyoming County Libraries.

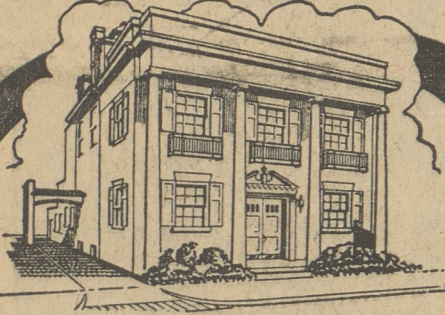

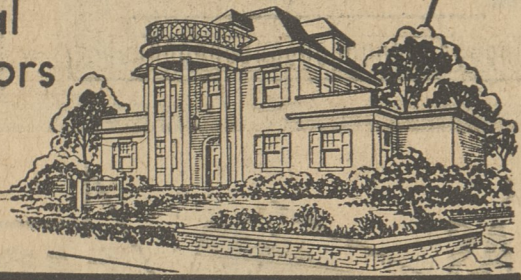
