Missing Man, 71 Is Found Dead

John Leek, Shavertown Suffered Fatal Stroke

John Leek, 71, missing since he started from the home of his niece Mrs. Chester Nesbitt, Main Highway, Shavertown, for a walk in East Dallas Saturday morning, was found dead Monday morning on the Alfred Miller farm, Dallas RD 3.

Mrs. Nesbitt had searched every road within walking distance on Saturday. It was her uncle's custom to take a walk every morning, and usually Mrs. Nesbitt picked him up after a reasonable time.

By Saturday night the search widened, local police and State police joining.

Retracing the lost man's route he apparently walked into the woods near the East Dallas Methodist Church, and emerging, lost his direction, turning up the hill instead of staying on the highway.
