Public Notice The following ordinance will be acted upon at an adjourned meeting on November 16, 1961, 8 P.M. in Township Building.

An Ordinance accepting as Township Roads certain roads in Kingston Township, laying out and opening the same as public roads of said township. BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Supervisors of Kingston Township at a regular meeting assembled, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same:

Section 1: That the following described roads situate in Kingston Township all being, in the considered judgement of the Supervisors of said Township, necessary for the public convenience, are hereby laid out, adopted and opened as public roads of said Township, as follows:

(a) TERRACE AVENUE: ALL THAT PARCEL of land being forty (40) feet wide and one thousand seven hundred ninety six (1,796) feet long, improved with an eighteen (18) foot macadam road, the center line of which is described as follows: BEGINNING at a point in the center of a street known as Terrace Avenue, where Terrace Avenue crosses the line of lands of B. C. Banks and the Leighton Estate; THENCE along a sixteen (16) degree curve to the right with radius of three hundred fifty nine and twenty six one-hundredths (359.26) feet for a distance of one hundred eighty and sixty two one-hundredths (180.62) feet to a point; THENCE along a fifteen (15) degree curve to the left with radius of three hundred eighty three and six one-hundredths (383.06) feet for a distance of one hundred ninety two and sixty seven (192.67) feet to a point; THENCE North forty seven (47) degrees twenty four (24) minutes East for a distance of one thousand four hundred twenty three (1,423) feet to an intersection with LP 40054 known as Bunker Hill Road.

(b) PERRIN AVENUE (formerly Terrace Drive): ALL THE following piece or parcel of land constituting Perrin Avenue, Kingston Township, being of a total width of thirty three (33) feet and extending sixteen and five tenths (16.5) feet on each side of the following described line, the center line of said street: BEGINNING at a point in the corner line of Perrin Avenue at its junction with Mt. Airy Road; THENCE South seventeen (17) degrees fifty three (53) minutes East four hundred ninety and eighty seven one-hundredths (490.87) feet to a point; THENCE South ten (10) degrees forty (40) minutes East four hundred fifty and sixty

five one-hundredths (450.65) feet to a point.

(c) SHADETREE ROAD: BEGINNING at a point in the center of the intersection of Woodbine Road and Shadetre Road as shown on map of "Midway Manor" dated April 16, 1959, as prepared by Sturdevant-Dilley Engineering Company, copy whereof is on file in the office of the Supervisors of Kingston Township; THENCE North sixty three (63) degrees fifty (50) minutes East three hundred forty one (341) feet, more or less, to the center of the intersection of Shadetre Road and State Highway No. 40054 and extending, on each side of said line a distance of twenty-five (25) feet, said above described line being the middle line of said street.

(d) WOODBINE ROAD: BEGINNING at a point in the center of the intersection of Woodbine Road and Shadetre Road as shown on map of Midway Manor, dated April 16, 1959 as prepared by Sturdevant-Dilley Engineering Co., copy whereof is on file in the office of the Supervisors of Kingston Township; THENCE North twenty six (26) degrees ten (10) minutes West five hundred fifty six and twenty five one-hundredths (556.25) feet, more or less to a point; HENCE on a curve to the left with a radius of fifty one and eleven one-hundredths (51.11) feet North sixteen (16) degrees fifty six (46) minutes West fifty six and twenty five one-hundredths (56.25) feet to a point; THENCE North forty two (42) degrees fifty six (56) minutes West one hundred fifty (150) feet, more or less to the center of the intersection of said Woodbine Road and the Township Road known as Howell Road, said above described line being the center line of said road and extending twenty five (25) feet on each side thereof.

Section 2: The proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized to advertise this ordinance and to do such other things as are necessary to be done in accordance with the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided.
