

## Four Lake-Lehman Tri-Hi-Y Girls Are Delegates To U.N. Assembly

The United Nations will be the subject of a special Youth and Government Citizenship Project in which Area Tri-Hi-Y girls will participate during this school year. At a special State YMCA District United Nations Assembly held November 18 at Scranton two members of the Lake-Noxen Tri-Hi-Y Club and two members of the Lehman Tri-Hi-Y Club were chosen to represent the Nation of Afghanistan in the State-wide Model United Nations Assembly scheduled in Harrisburg March 2 and 3. Kay Williams and Sandra Yellitz of Lake-Noxen Tri-Hi-Y Club and Diane Moringstar and Carol Owens, Lehman Tri-Hi-Y Club, have been chosen to participate in this year's Model United Nations Assembly. Kay Williams was also elected to serve as Chaplain.

360 selected Senior Tri-Hi-Y girls from all over Pennsylvania. This is the seventh time the State YMCA has sponsored the biennial United Nations Assembly for Tri-Hi-Y girls. On alternate years the 'Y' sponsors the Model Legislature for Senior Hi-Y boys as part of its state-wide Youth and Government citizenship training program.

An important part of the Model United Nations program is the creation of U. N. proposals by each club, studied and prepared in individual club meetings with help of an adult advisor. This year it is anticipated that many groups will offer special space proposals which will be debated at the Model United Nations in Harrisburg.

Girls will travel by charter bus to Harrisburg. For many sessions of the United Nations and the International Banquet they will appear in the costumes which they have prepared for their Nation.

## George Sayre Is Fatally Burned

### Pilot Light Ignites Inflammable Cement

Burned so completely by a flash fire that it was a miracle that he survived for even a moment, George Sayre died a week after the accident, lingering in a Montclair, N. J. hospital until November 21.

Mr. Sayre, 56 year old resident of his native Kunkle, was an expert cabinet-maker, having gone into business for himself after spending fifteen years as ace craftsman of the Ruggles Lumber Company.

A week before the tragedy, he had gone to New Jersey to install cabinets in a remodelled kitchen. The pilot light was burning. Inflammable cement used in laying of the tops of cabinets burst into flame across the entire length of the surface being treated.

George Sayre was a dedicated man. He was a truly good man, exemplifying in every act of his daily life the concepts and teachings of Christ. He was a friend to everybody, his truth and integrity shining through his smallest action. He had limitless patience and understanding.

At Christmas time, Mr. Sayre led a band of carollers about the community, accepting contributions for his small Seventh Day Adventist Church in Beaumont. He had been an elder of the church for thirty years.

People who had learned to expect this gentle man's knock upon the door in the evenings before Christmas, were deeply shocked to learn that they would never see him again. His visit, for many of us, was a part of Christmas.

He was a son of Clinton Sayre and the late Julia Weaver Sayre.

Besides his father, he leaves his wife, the former Grace Robbins; a son, Lauren, Kunkle; a daughter, Mrs. Harry Miller, Takoma Park, Md.; three grandchildren; six sisters: Mrs. Herbert Phillips, Tunkhannock; Mrs. Arthur Kocher, Orlando, Fla.; Mrs. Leo Cobert, Endicott, N. Y.; Mrs. John Torus, Kingston; Mrs. Stacy Schoonover, Center Moreland; Mrs. Henry Shupp, Kunkle; brothers: Russell, Pringle, and Charles, Endicott, N. Y.

## To Speak At Huntsville

In observance of Woman's Day Sunday, December 3 at Huntsville Christian Church at the morning service, Miss Margaret Lawrence will speak under auspices of the Christian Women's Fellowship. Mrs. Walter Covert, president.

Miss Lawrence, a former missionary to China, is now on the field staff of the United Christian Missionary Society of Christian Churches. In the course of her work on planning and observance of World Day of Prayer for 1961 on its seventy-fifth anniversary, she made arrangements for twenty-four Latin-American women from twenty countries to meet in Lima, Peru, February 12 to 17. As a sequel to this meeting, Miss Lawrence visited mission stations in Argentina and Paraguay.

Earlier, Miss Lawrence took part in the English Women's convention and the Scottish convention, visited the Netherlands, Germany, Switzerland, France, in attendance on ecumenical conventions.

Miss Lawrence went to China in 1925, teaching in Nanking. Returning to China in 1929 as a missionary, she taught at Wuhu, 200 miles west of Shanghai. Missionaries were forced out of the country in 1948, when she left Nanking where she had been teaching in a school for girls.

Further missionary teaching experience was in mission schools in Tokyo.

A native of Missouri, Miss Lawrence studied at William Woods College, Drake University, Western Reserve, Kennedy School of Missions, and Yale Divinity School.
