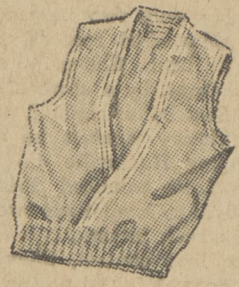

Methodist Church Crusade For One And A Half Million Dollars

"Let's make it unanimous!"

With this challenge a capacity audience in Boulevard Methodist Church in Binghamton rose to its feet in high enthusiasm. The Rev. Dr. George M. Bell, 90-year old former District Superintendent pronounced the benediction.

Our Back Mountain Methodists (there are more than 5000 of them) were represented by 9 ministers and lay members of our 21 Methodist Churches. The names of the ministers followed by the names of the lay members who represent the churches at Conference sessions are: Alderson, Rev. John A. Gordon, E. Ralph Kerlin; Carverton, Rev. Wm. W. James M. Garahan, Wm. LaBar; Shavertown, Rev. Robert DeWitt Yost, John Henninger; Trucksville, Rev. Robert E. Germond, Mrs. Herbert Williams; Huntsville, Rev. C. Earle Cowden, Elmer Daley (Evans Falls), and Mrs. Clarence Elston (Huntsville). Rev. Charles H. Gilbert a retired minister from Mt. Zion also attended.

It was at a special session of Wyoming Conference called for December 6 that the resolution, previously studied and explained at four district meetings, was ratified. The resolution in part is: "That the Wyoming Conference undertake a financial Crusade to undergird the institutions, agencies and causes of the Conference and the Church, including contributions to the Bishop's Fund for Puerto Rico. . . . That the goal of the Crusade be set to yield \$1,346,361 . . . extending over a four-year period."

These askings are mostly non-recurring capital fund items including 13 agencies through which Methodists promote vital spiritual, educational, benevolent and social work.

Debating over amendments was lively but friendly. One amendment to provide a full-time Director of Youth Work was introduced by the Rev. Robert Lukens of Kingston Methodist Church. After considerable pro- and con- it was overwhelmingly approved. This youth-work has been long discussed and often postponed for a number of years.

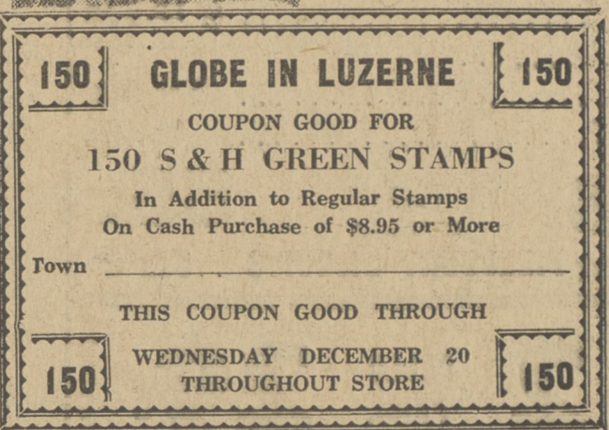
