Dorothy E. Kintzer

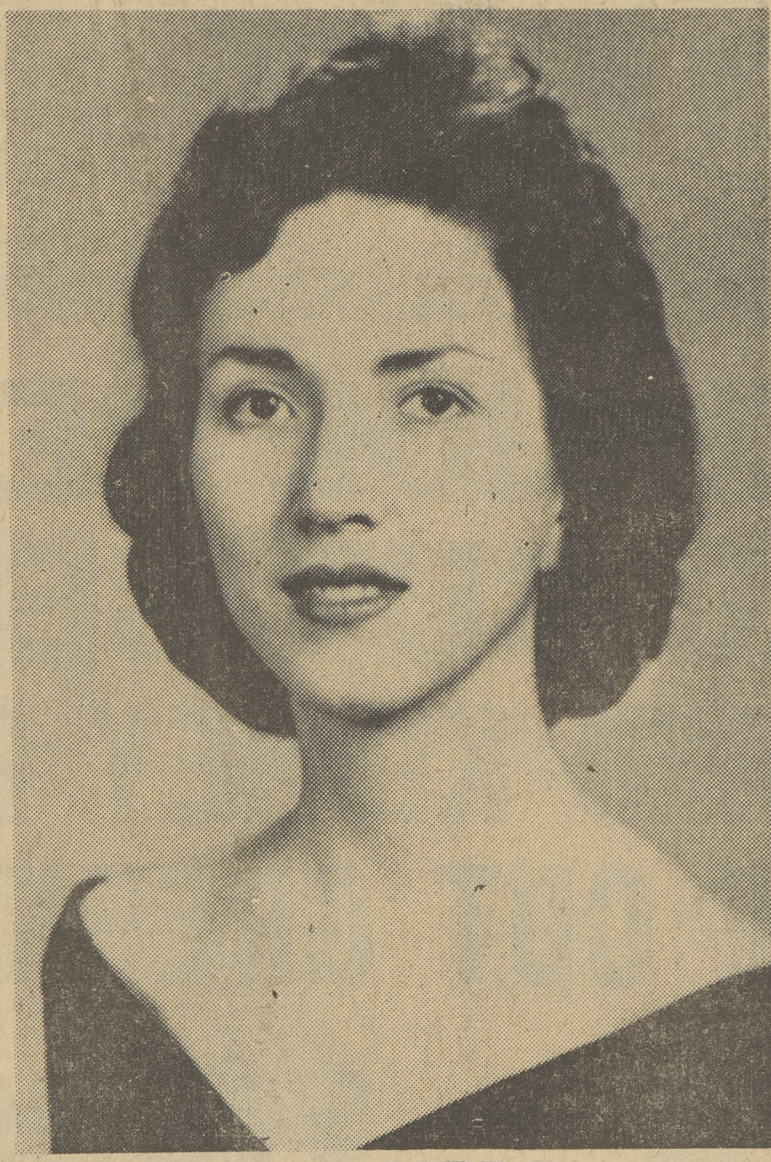

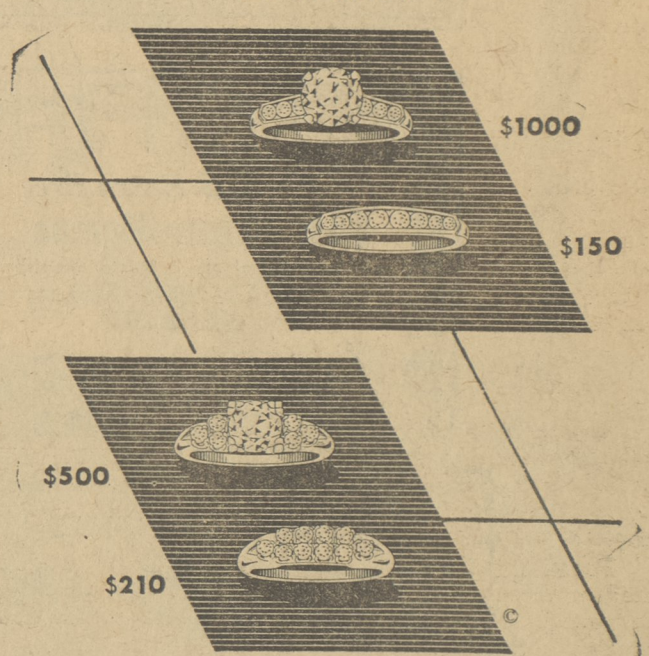
