Sales Of \$1,900
Net Only 58 Dollars

The Value Shop, a used clothing exchange, which has been operated for the past ten years by Dallas-unusual asoc will close permanently on Saturday, January 27. This action was voted by the Club at its last meeting after it was found that profits for the last year's operations amounted to only \$58. Although gross sales amounted to \$1,900, rental of \$600 per year and commissions to those who supplied the used clothing cut into income to such an extent that continuation of the Shop is not feasible.

During its ten years of operation the shop was staffed by volunteer workers. More recently Mrs. Ann Stenger and Mrs. Algert Antanaitis gave a great deal of time to the project.

The Shop will remain open this Thursday, Friday and Saturday and every day next week from 1 to 4 and 7 to 9 p.m. so that those who have left clothing within the past sixty days can pick it up, otherwise it will become the property of the Woman's Club.
