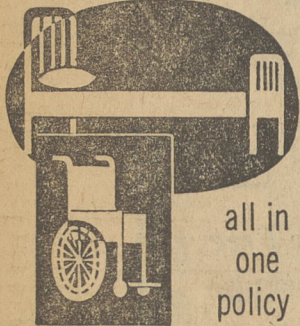
Sympathy of the community goes to the family of John R. Allen. Mr. Allen passed away Sunday. His wife is the former Marjorie Bell of Shavertown.

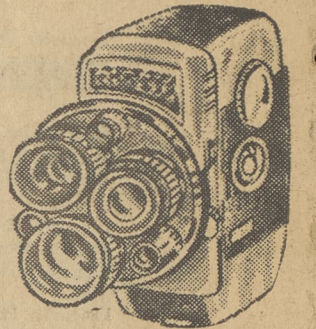
