If you should hear of a Rock and Gen show, be sure to take it in."

Three cows, Hillside Bessie Wizard of Oz with 633 pounds of butterfat; Hillside Commando Jackie, 775 pounds; Hillside Onyx Jessie of Oz, 934 pounds contrast strongly with the average U.S. dairy cow production of 265 pounds of butterfat in 365 days. At Sandsdale, Edgehill Sovereign Ava scored 91 points. Sandsdale Sovereign Molly, a nine-year old produced 687 pounds of butterfat. Sandsdale Sov Reflection Autumn three-year old, produced 758 pounds. Cows were milked twice daily. Period of time, 365 days. Pennsylvania State University supervised weighing and testing.

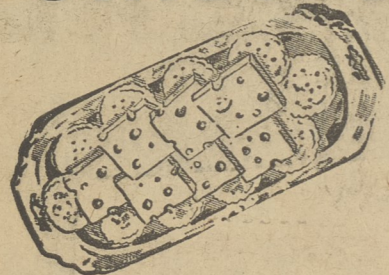

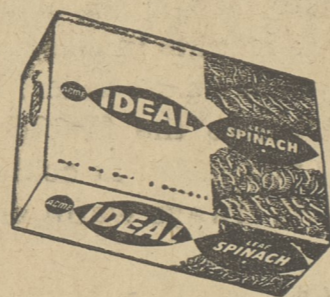
