After a reception held at the Winterstein Restaurant, the couple left for a week's trip. They will reside at 41 North Main Street, Shickshinny.

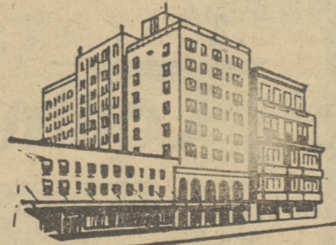
Flower Club Plans Trip To International Show
