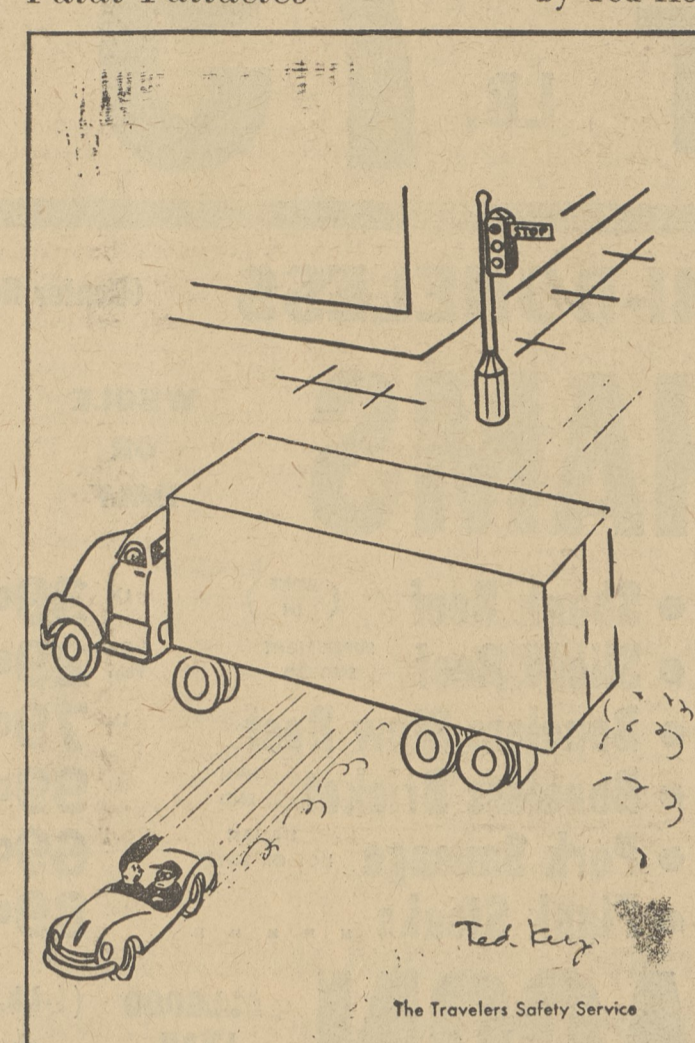

Auctioneers Must Take Examination

And Purchase A \$25 State License

Secretary of the Commonwealth E. James Trimarchi, Jr., has reminded auctioneers that the deadline to apply for a State License is March 1.

Secretary Trimarchi, whose office is charged with administering the new Auctioneers' License Act, said about 1,500 applications have been distributed but the response has been poor. The Act, passed by the 1961 General Assembly, requires that anyone wishing to conduct auctions in Pennsylvania be licensed by the Department of State.

"Although we believe now there may be more auctioneers than originally anticipated — perhaps as many as 2,000," he said, "the responsibility to get the license is theirs."

"More applications are being printed, and they are available to anyone who wants one."

"However, we do not have a complete list of all the auctioneers and apprentice auctioneers in the Commonwealth, and some of the initiative will have to be taken by them if they want to practice their trade in Pennsylvania."

Secretary Trimarchi also said his Department has received only 200 applications to date, but that some of them had to be returned because they were not accompanied by a certified check or money order.

"Under no circumstances," he said, "can we accept an application that is not accompanied by a certified check or money order. We cannot accept personal checks in payment of the required fees."

Fees for the annual licenses are \$25.00 for experienced auctioneers and \$10.00 for apprentice auctioneers, i.e., auctioneers with less than two years' experience.

To qualify, auctioneers must be 21 years of age or older. Apprentice auctioneers must be at least 18 years old.

The Commonwealth will offer quarterly examinations for all new license applicants, the first examination to be given on Saturday, April 14th.

Secretary Trimarchi said experienced auctioneers will be exempted from the April examination if they establish that they have at least two years' experience by March 1st, the deadline for filing applications.

In the future the examinations will be held on the second Saturday of January, April, July and October.
