Huntsville Topples Saints 62-57 To Capture Play-offs

In the final night of Church League action for the season, Huntsville, regular season champs, combined fine team play and dominating rebounding to dash St. Therese's hopes of becoming the League's "Cinderella" team by beating the Saints 62-57 and thus adding the play-off championship to their season's laurels.

The rebounding of "Pooch" Kozik, Don Fossedal, Charlie Brobst, and Bill Straussler at key moments kept the Saints from closing the gap. At one time Huntsville led by 14 points, but St. Therese's chopped the lead to four points with a few minutes remaining in the game.

Kozik was also the leading scorer for the winners with 17 points, followed by Bill Straussler, who played one of the best games of the season, with 13. Clint Brobst had 10 counters. For the Saints, Pete Letts was the only bright spot in the shooting department as several times the Saints would have their shots roll off the rim. Pete finished the contest as high man with 22 points, followed by Jack Hogan with 10.

In an exhibition game, Harvey Lake gave Shavertown the worst trouncing of the year, winning by

the astronomical score of 76-43.

Don "Zeek" Hinkle led the scoring for the Lakers with 27 points, supported by Gene Brobst's 14 and Fred Price's 13 tallies. For Shavertown, Don Rome took scoring honors with 18 points, backed up by Bob Hontz's 12.

Also in an exhibition contest, Prince of Peace beat East Dallas 51-49.

Bob Coolbaugh paced the winners with 17 points and rugged rebounding, followed by Jim Thomas with 12 points.

Wes Evans was the leading scorer for the losers with 14 points, followed by Frank Tencza with 12 and Chuck Lasher, who also did a lot of rebounding, with 10.

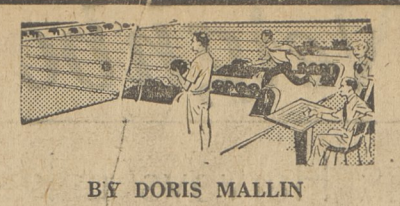
