CROWN MAJOR LEAGUE

A new league record was set Friday night when Monk Plumbing and Heating spilled 2811 total pins.

Monk's big series included a first game of 1006 and was rolled against Mathers Black Toppers, adding another 4 points to its lead position as second place American Legion lost all to Jim-Jon.

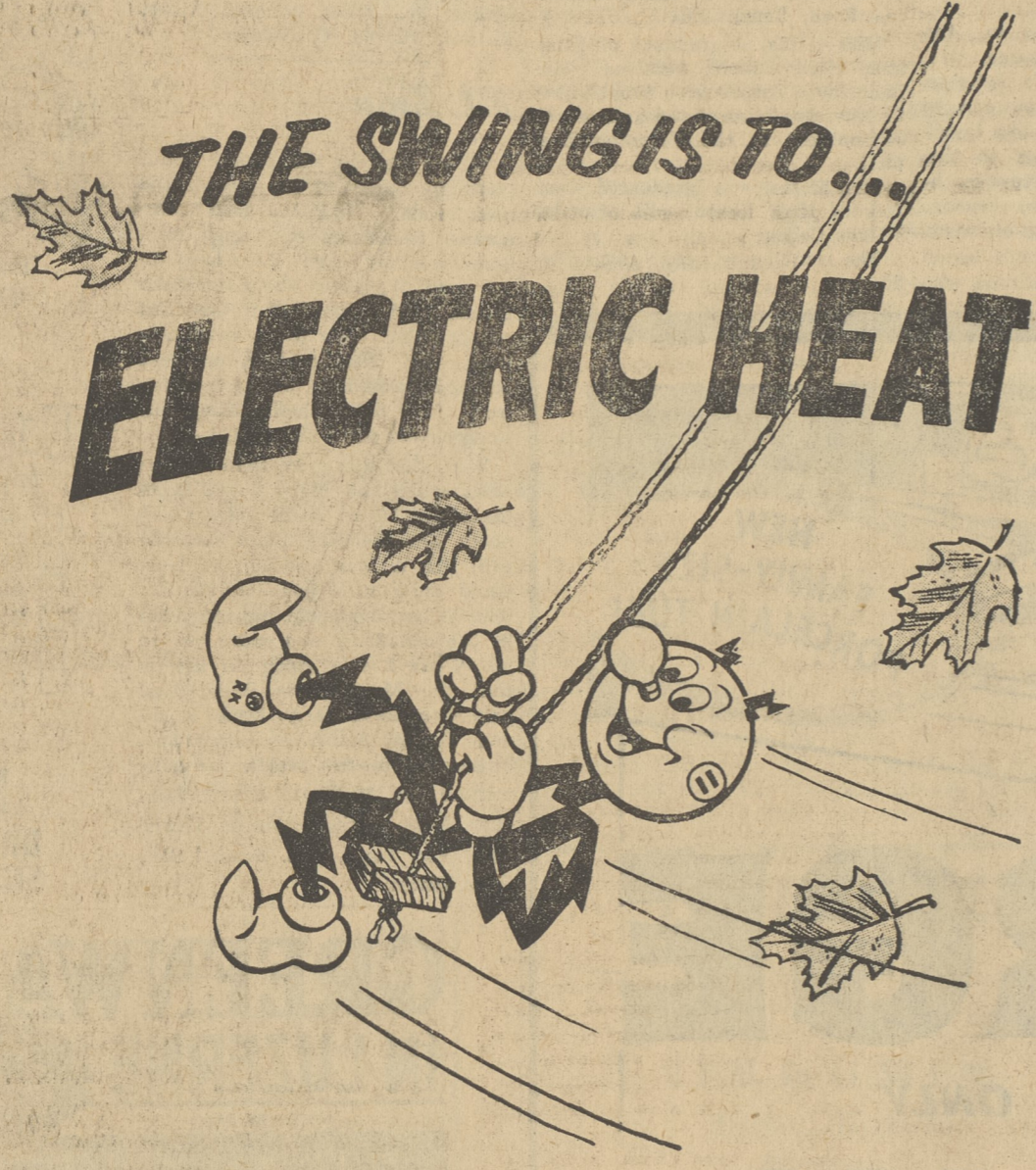
