The school, starting some years ago as a brainchild of Dallas Borough PTA, outgrew its swaddling clothes two years ago, and is now a full-fledged extension school housed in Dallas Senior High School four evenings a week, and taught by members of the faculty.

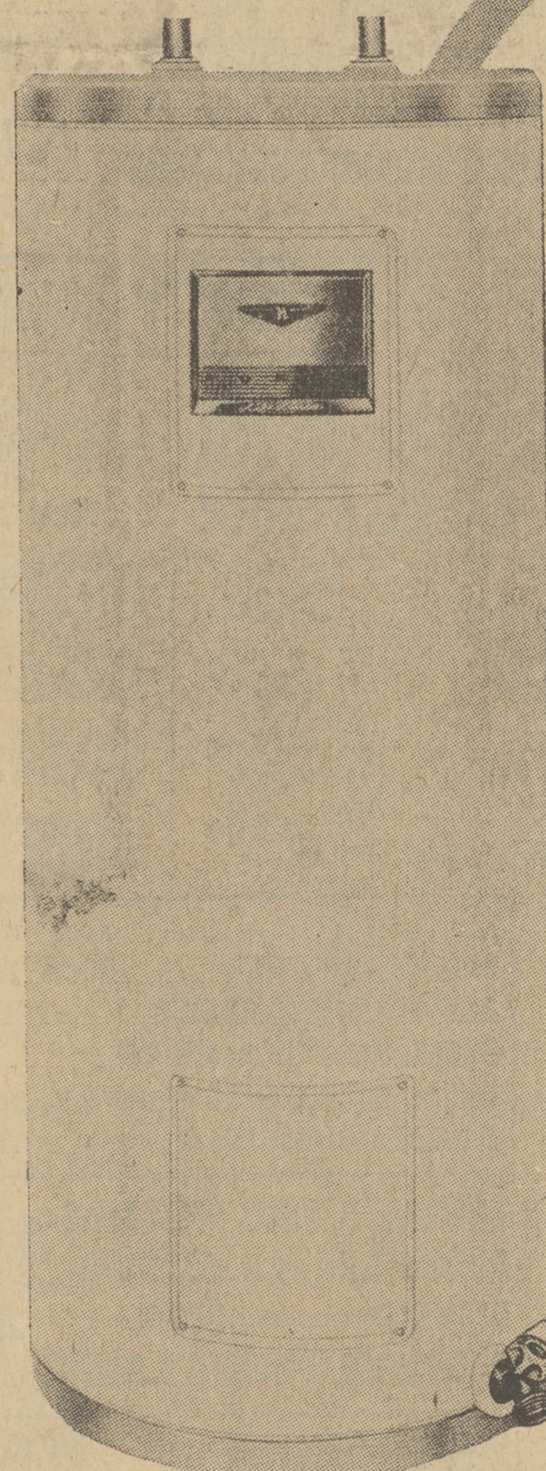
