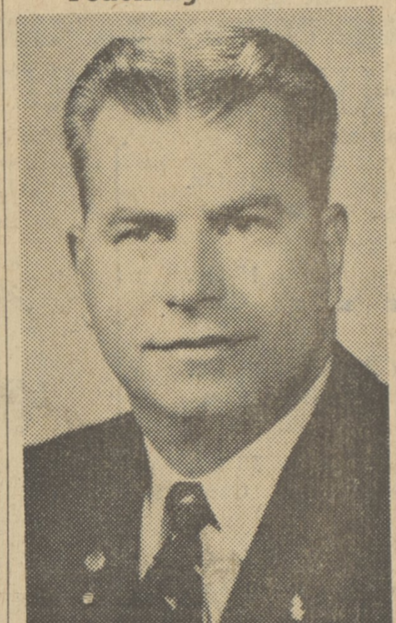
ELEMENTARY BAND CONCERT

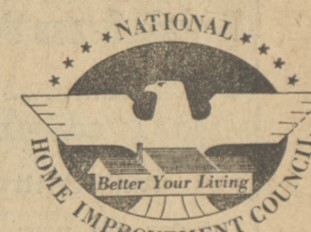
