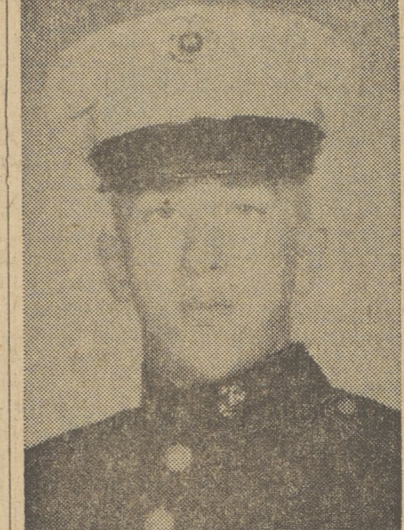
Kiwanis Club Members Hear Director Of Nursing, Retreat

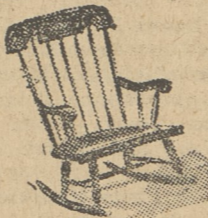

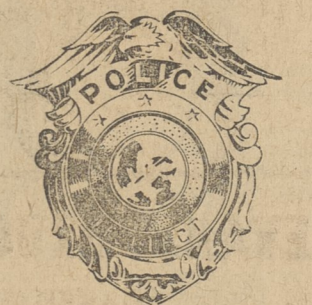
