Mormon Missionaries Canvass Area With Great Dignity And Restraint

Two elders from the Mormon Church, exceptionally nice young men, have been assigned to this general area as missionaries. On Easter Sunday, they drew a congregation of their faith, thirty in number at the Back Mountain YMCA, where they will hold services each week. They have been welcomed as speakers at Trucksville Methodist and Stella Presbyterian.

Elder Davis explains, "No, we are not financed by the church. Our parents feel that it is an important part of our education to go into the field, and do our share in building up the church. We set by enough money to finance, in part, our program, and we donate our time and efforts. Our parents are solidly back of us."

Approximately 255 Mormon missionaries give their services in a district composed of New York, New Jersey, and portions of Pennsylvania and Connecticut.

Elders are carefully selected. Not all young men qualify. But it is considered an honor to be chosen to carry the banner, and it is carried with great dignity, by soft-spoken young elders whose belief expresses itself in every word and every gesture.

Missionaries are predominantly men, explains Elder Davis, but young women may also enter the field, and there are a number of older married couples who work as a team.

At the end of two years, after having been shifted to several locations, no longer than six months in any one place, the elders return to Utah, having made their contribution to their church.

Elder Davis, having finished two years at a junior college, will enroll in the University of Utah. He has in mind something in the IBM field, and has also a leaning toward guidance. His companion has not yet started college. The two young men live in Kingston, which Davis will leave within the month, to take another assignment.

Lohman W. Hawk Dies At Veterans Hospital
