Building Code

Division of Sanitation of Pennsylvania Department of Health requires submission of plans for new construction, additions, or alterations of all buildings which are public, semi-public, or commercial in nature, where the public receives a service which has public health significance, such as parks, camps,

and also any business place where sewage systems are to be of the septic tank-subsurface disposal type and also those places which are going to use other than public water supplies.
