**CROWN MAJOR LEAGUE**  
Top position in Major League was inched by Monk Plumbing and Heating Friday night when the leading "plumbers" split 2-2 with Parry's Gulf Service. First two games were close, taken by Monk's team, but the "Gulf men" came back at the end to take lead in pin count. Dallas Shopping Center was biggest threat to the "heat men", the Center took 4 points from Jim-Jon. Monk's now has 85 points; Dallas Shopping 79½; American Legion, with 3 from West Side Novelty, has 78.

Big scorer for top team and leading night's scoring was

Cliff Garris who pounded the boards to the tune of 651 including 219-222-210 games. Nick Stredny led Dallas Nursery to a 4 point victory over Phillips, Supply as he scattered 624 pins with a 190 and high 246. Frank Kardell tied the high 246. Frank spilled 625 pins for Dallas Shopping Center and duplicated Nick's first two games, ending the third with 189, 1 pin over Nick. Bill Allabaugh crashed through with 202-195-205 (602) in Phillips' battle against the Nursery. Jack Landis hit 192-226 (606) for Parry's.

Charlie Williams rolled 214 (579). Bruce Varner, 192-207 (576) for "Shopping Center"; Bob Fallon with 196-205 (579) and Bob Moore, 202 (571) led Birth's Esso to take 3 from Mathers Black Toppers, while Charles Nafus hit 236 (570) for Mathers. Andy Matte and Tony Pineo turned in high scores for West Side. Andy spilled 222 (577) and Tony blasted away a 256 (586). Mike Corgan led Gosart's attack on Shavertown Lumber with 212-199 (577). Gosart's took 3 points, second game by only 11.

Dallas Shopping Center copped honors when it rolled 2833 total pins, beating original record of 2811 set by Monk Plumbing. Monk's still holds record for single high with 1009. Bob Moore is leading with high series of 704 and Chill Williams, single high of 257.
