All 54 high schools in Luzerne County have received a set of radiological monitoring instruments?

These instruments are to be used for the training of Juniors and Seniors in Science and Physics Classes as Radiological Monitors.

When each course of instruction is completed the Principal of the high school will inform the Local Civil Defense Director and submit to him the names and addresses of the students involved.

The Local Director should then utilize the newly trained personnel in his Radiological Monitoring Service.

Each Local Director should check with the High School principal to see if the instruments are in use, if students are being given the course, and that he receives a list of personnel to be assigned as Monitors.

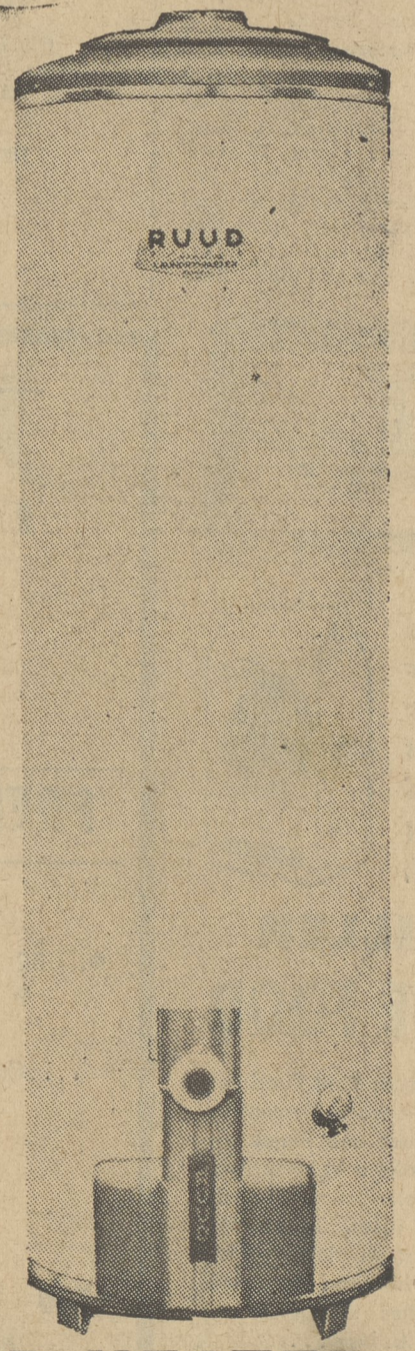
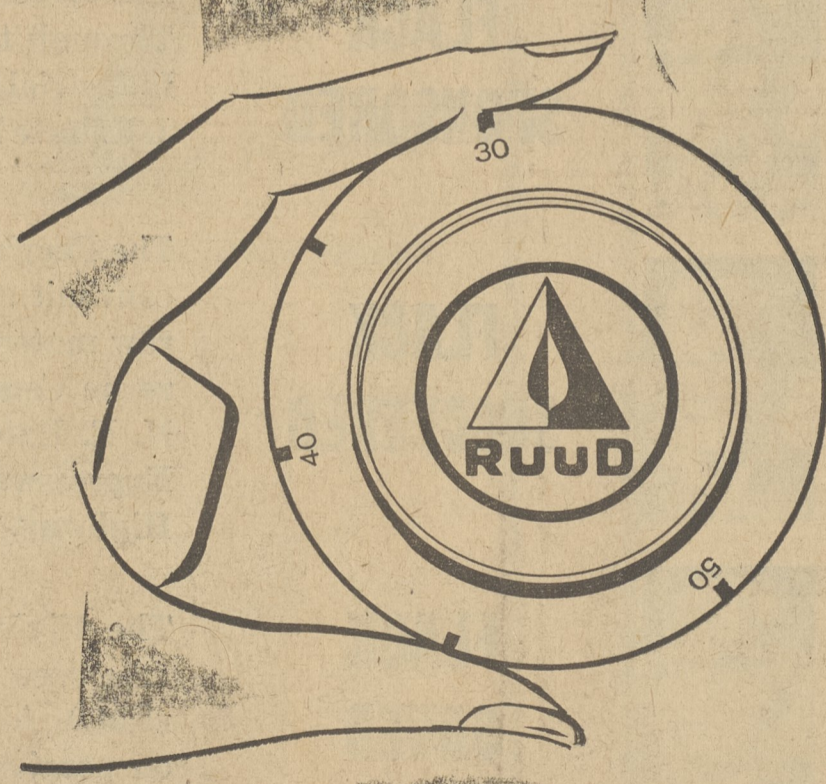
