Miss Martin has been dietician at the Colonade, Louisville, Ky.; at Lake Placid, N. Y., and for six years for Statler Hotels.

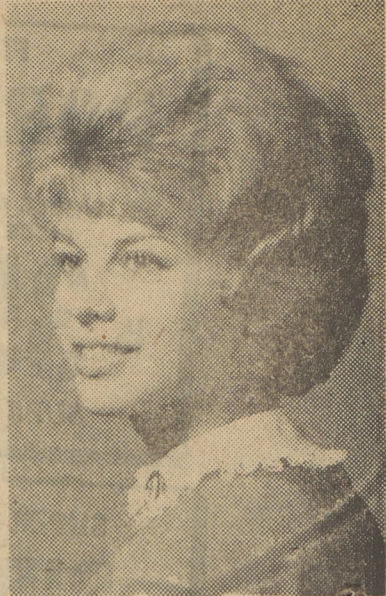
She is a graduate of Kingston Township High School and of College Miserioria. She took advanced work in nutrition at Women's College, Rutgers University, New Jersey.

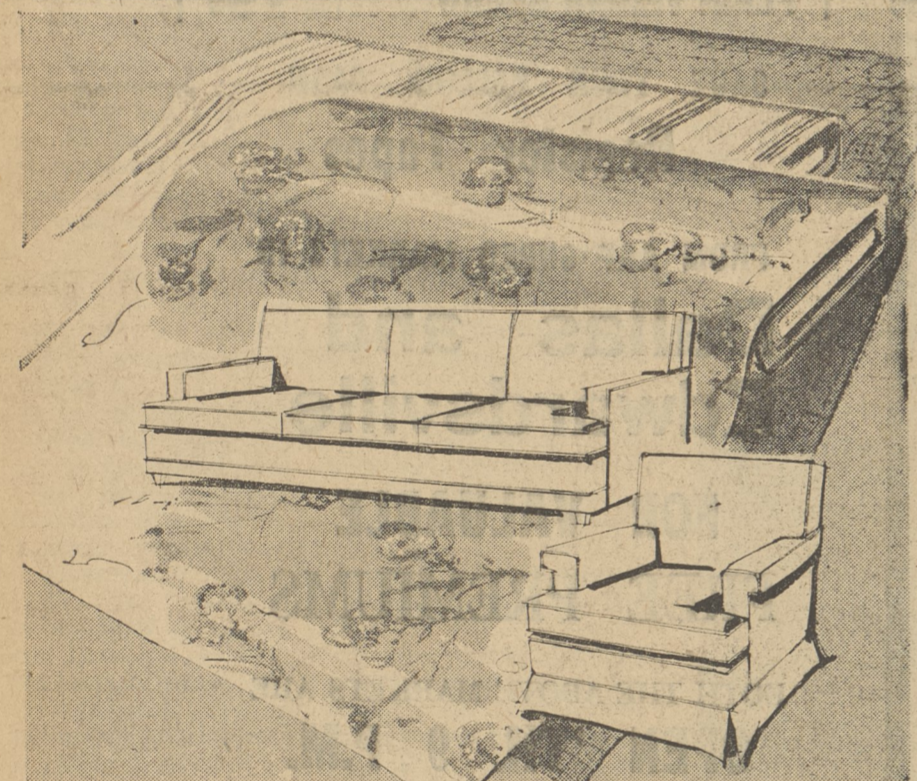

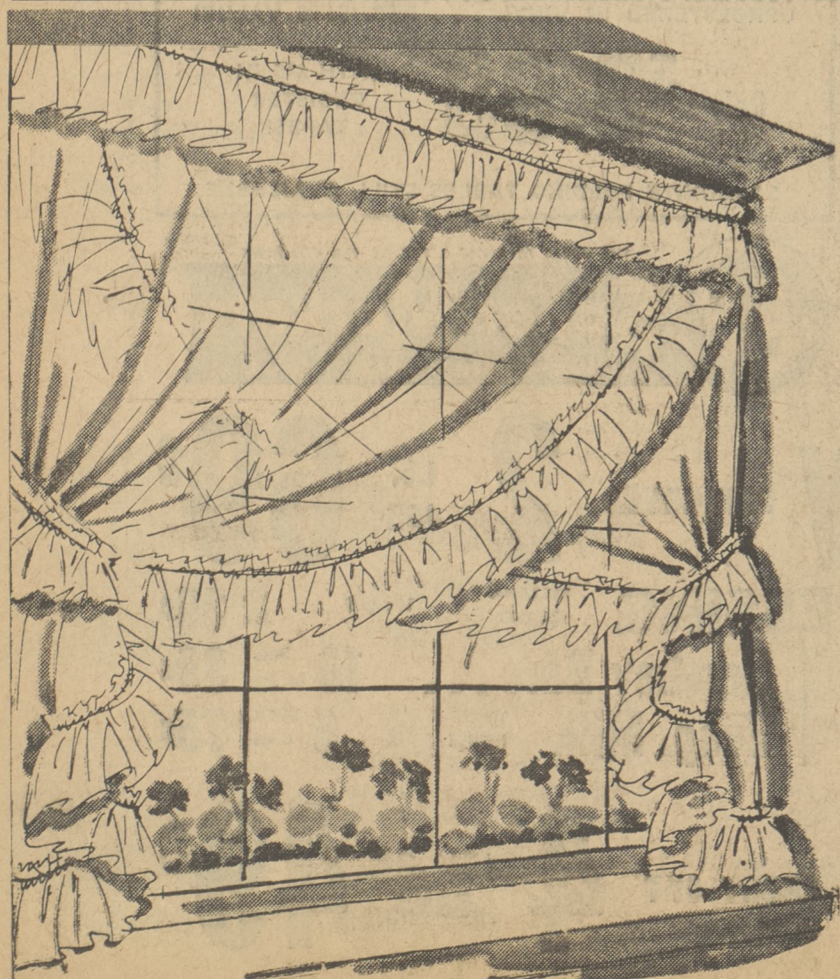
