Following the ceremony, a reception for all guests was held in the church parlors.

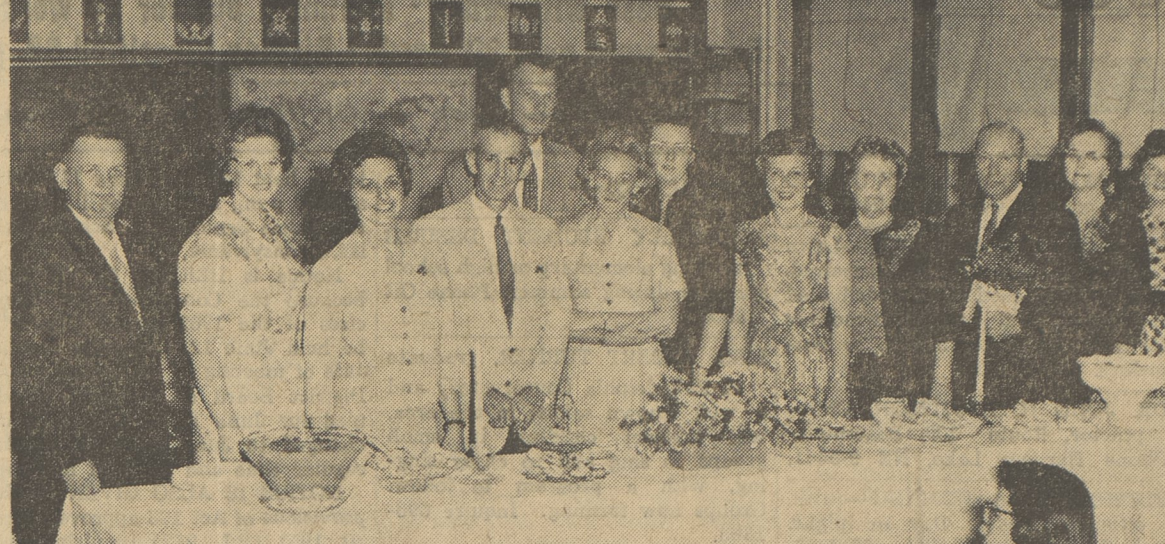
Mr. Bronson is employed by Linear Incorporated, Dallas. He is a graduate of Lake Township High School and completed courses at the Pennsylvania State University.
